HIGH POINT, Sept. 28 — (P) — State headquarters of the Veterans of Foreign Wars issued a statement here today saying it had protested to the Federal Public Housing administration against its rufusal to sell a 584-unit surplus FHA development at Wilmington to a group of World War veterans organized as "Veterans Homes,

The statement quoted Omar-B. Ketchum, national legislative director of the VFW, as charging that the FPHA action was "discriminating against our nonprofit veterans group," and not in line with the intentions of Congress in providing for dsposal of surplus property.

The FPHA, according to the statement, took the position it would not sell the property unless non-veterans were accepted by "Veterans Homes, Inc."


