

### NEWSPAPER JOINS RESIGNATION BAND

#### Chicago Sun Urges President To Name Republican State Secretary

Suggestions that President Truman resign in view of the Republican sweep of Congress attracted wide attention last night in the nation's press.

The Chicago Sun, which backed the Roosevelt-Truman ticket in 1944, urged resignation in an open letter to the Chief Executive. It said that "with hostile forces dominating the Congress and with you in control of the executive office, our foreign policy will be vacillating and our part in the pacifica-

tion of the world come to a stalemate. x x x  
"We believe that if at this time full responsibility be thrown upon the Republican party to develop and administer a national policy, the voters will have the issues cut clearly and intelligently for them in 1948."  
The Sun urged Mr. Truman to ask the Republican Congressmen to pick a member of their party to be appointed secretary of state, and then to resign in his favor.  
Senator Fulbright (D-Ark) similarly suggested that the President name a Republican secretary of state and resign, allowing him to succeed to the Presidency.

### Your GI Rights

Questions and Answers On Servicemen's Problems

WASHINGTON.—Here are some general questions from veterans and their relatives:

Q—My brother has had two years of college from his GI rights. He has two more coming to him, but the two years gave him his degree. Can he wait a couple of years and work in the meantime, then go back to school if he wants to get another degree on his GI rights?  
A—Yes.

Q—Where would be the best place to get information about how a veteran can use his priority for surplus property?  
A—One of the best sources of this information is a new pamphlet called "Veterans"—Your Guide to Surplus Property." You can get it free at WAA headquarters.

Q—When I was discharged two years ago, I borrowed money to buy a small business. It has prospered, and I would like to pay the loan off faster than I arranged

any, Washington, D. C., and at any of the 33 WAA regional offices and 149 WAA veterans' certification centers throughout the country.

Q—Does the government pay the funeral expenses when a veteran dies in a government hospital?  
A—When a veteran dies while hospitalized under the authority of the Veterans' Administration, the next-of-kin is queried as to the disposition of the body. The Veterans' Administration will assume the actual cost—not to exceed \$100—of burial and funeral, and will transport the body to any desired place of burial within the U. S.

A—You will save on the interest you otherwise would pay.  
Q—I am considering trying to get a loan-guarantee to buy a farm. Can you tell me the maximum length of time I will have to pay this money back?  
A—You will have 40 years in which to pay it back.
