British Officials Issue Ultimatum

JERUSALEM, Jan. 27.—(AP)—British officials issued an ultimatum to Jewish leaders tonight that military control would be imposed on portions of Palestine unless kidnappers released two prominent British subjects abducted within 18 hours of each other.

RUSSIA SUBMITS PLAN FOR REICH

Foreign Ministers Council Hears Plea For Big 4 To Write Treaty

LONDON, Jan. 27.—(AP)—Russia submitted a memorandum to the deputy foreign ministers council today proposing that the United States, Britain, Russia and France write a formal peace treaty for Germany which would be presented to a future "German state" for ratification.

The proposal ignored an American suggestion of last week that a "peace statute" be adopted instead of a formal treaty. American sources said a clarification of the Russian plan would be sought.
