The bill as offered by Lennon further specifies that the appointee, if from without the department, must have at least two years Federal Bureau of Investigation training and be recommended for the position by the head of the FBI or must have served at least five years in the police department of a city not less than 25,000 population, and also receive the recom-mendation of the FBI head. Other changes in the bill gave

to the governing body the right of promotion of members of the fire and police departments and the right to demote the chiefs of the forces, provided that the rank to which the chiefs are demoted is not lower than that held by the person in question at the time he was promoted to head the department.

The measure called for the election of a five man committee in both departments to recommend promotions to the chiefs of the forces, but gives the governing review or approval.


