Unique Rescue

FAIRBANKS, Alaska, April 4—(AP)—One parachute jumper saved the life of another during a task force frigid paratroop jump by snatching his collapsed chute and holding on until both reached the earth safely, the Army disclosed today.

The Army report said the incident occurred Tuesday. Capt. Charles A. Harris of Watonville, Ill., was the man rescued and Pfc. Raymond G. Kenyon of Greenwich, R. I., the rescuer. Harris' chute collapsed when a crosswind blew the two men together about 100 feet above the ground.
