"The cornerstone of this beautiful theater, which reflects so much credit on the town, was laid two days after Christmas, in the year 1855. James F. Post was the architect and builder. He also was the architect of the magnificent Bellamy house at Fifth and Market. The famous French Opera House in New Orleans, destroyed by fire. was of the same period and New Orleans is working on a project to have it rebuilt.

"The hall, while very run-down, still has its beautiful proportions and the original curtains. It was opened by the Thalians with a performance of a musical extrava-ganza titled 'The Invisible Prince,' followed by a farce 'Box and Cox, on the night of December 2, 1857. One wonders how an audience described as 'brilliant' ever sat down with half of its members in voluminous hoop-skirts if the seats were anything like they are to-

Professional as well as amateur performances were given in the hall, with Joseph Jefferson managing a stock company which played there for two seasons. Savini, the great Italian actor; Janashek, the Polish actress; Richard Mansfield, Mary Anderson and in later years Maude Adams; Nazimova, and Robert Mantell are among the great figures of the stage who trod the boards of Thalian Hall.
