Senate Votes On Aid Today

Marshall Declares Loans To Greece-Turkey "Indispensable"

WASHINGTON, April 21.—(AP)—Secretary of State Marshall declared today that President Truman's program of aiding Greece and Turkey against Communism is urgent and "indispensable."

Senator Vandenberg (R-Mich.) placed the message from Marshall in Moscow before the Senate as it plodded toward a vote tomorrow, with passage certain. Marshall's message said in full: "Dear Senator Vandenberg: I understand some question has arisen as to my participation in the Greek-Turkish aid program."

"When I reached Paris on March 26, the President telegraphed the proposed text of his message of March 12 and I informed the (State) department that I fully concurred."
