

AFL EXPANDS STATE PROGRAM

Field Representative To Assist President In Labor Activities

President C. A. Fink, elected to head the North Carolina Federation of Labor for his 11th consecutive term, today begins expanded duties throughout the state.

He will have additional field representatives to assist in organization, political activities, and directing the general growth of or-

ganized labor in an intensive campaign authorized for North Carolina.

The action of naming Fink as a full time representative was the first step of the newly organized executive board at its initial meeting last night, shortly after the state convention adjourned.

Special attention will be paid by Fink to organizing clerks in retail stores, a membership drive authorized at the convention.

Last night's action by the executive board was in line with the adoption of an amendment to the state constitution. The convention backed Fink's stand at the recent general state assembly at Raleigh when persons declared that the labor officials did not speak for the rank and file of AFL members when he attacked the anti-closed shop bill.
