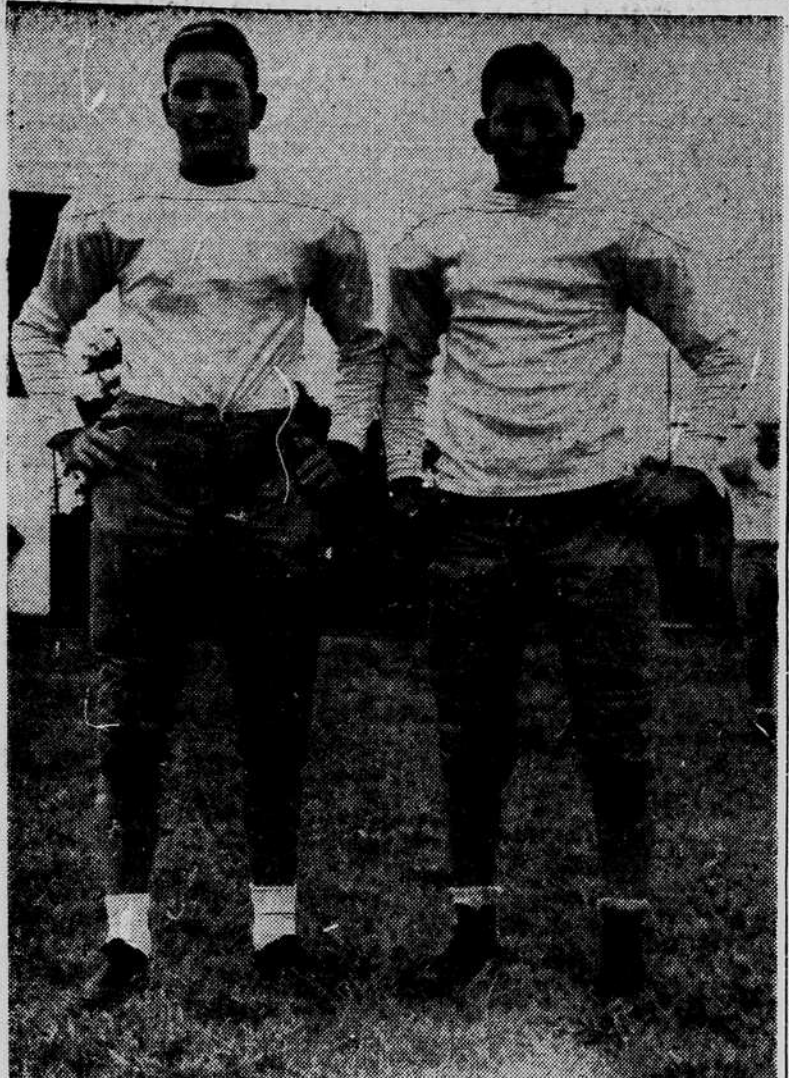

Swart, Johnson Go To N. C. State; Sykes Will Run Pigskin For Georgia Tech; New Hanover High School Eleven Shaping Up

Rudy Johnson, Bubba Sykes, and William Swart, all members of the 1946 New Hanover high school football team, will be seeing action on college grids this season, it was learned by the Star yesterday.

Johnson, who alternated with Sykes at fullback most of last season, goes to N. C. State along with 200-pound Swart. Sykes is casting his lot with Georgia Tech.

Johnson came to Wilmington from South Carolina last year, and even though bothered by charley-homes almost all season, Rudy became one of NHHHS's most dependable runners. Johnson was Coach Brogden's best safety man. He alternated with Sykes at fullback most of the year.

Both Swart and Johnson have been working out with the Wildcat squad lately so they will be in fairly good shape when Wolfpack Skipper Beattie Feathers rings the practice gong the latter part of this month.

Even though Coach Leon Brogden has put no one at any position yet in practice, here is the way the lineup will probably shape up this season.

Jimmy Piner and Jim Gibson, both regulars in 1946, are certain of the halfback slots. They are the lunging type of backs and either boy is good for at least three yards on every buck. Piner's defensive ability as a line backer is unsurpassed in the Eastern conference.

Quarterback goes to either Irv in Gore, who is being switched from guard, or 1946 second stringer Johnny Crowley. Gore's passing is as good as any exhibited at the Wildcat drills yet, but he must learn the art of calling the right play at the right moment, a gift that comes only with experience.
