More Loans To England Frowned On

J. Melville Broughton Defends Tobacco Farmers From Loss

LEAF MARKET HURT

Says England Not Using Loans To Purchase From The U. S.

FARMVILLE, Aug. 23- (AP) Broughton, speaking here today before a meeting of the Eastern Warehouse association, urged that conditions be placed on future loans to Great Britain in order to protect the American far

Attlee, according to a report in the New York Times, declared the curtailment of British purchases of tobacco from the United States already bad obtained this result, Broughton said. "One of the avowed purposes of his nation's loan to Great Britain was to make possible the purchase of American goods and commodities," Broughton said. "I was in favor of that loan, and will be in favor of helping Great Britain again-if that becomes necessary. But it should be understood that any further loan carries the condition that Great Britain will refrain from any tax or action designed to reduce the income of the American farmer.

"This nation is, and should be a good neighbor and ally to Great Britain. But we cannot be that at the costs of destroying of reducthe American standard of living. Congress must take the nemeasures to afeguard the farmers from any such attempt on the part of Great Britain or any other nation.'

Full Force of 75-Mile Gale Expected To Hit Galveston At Midnight, Two A. M. Wilmington Time, Weather Men Say

GALVESSTON, Tex., Aug. 23.—(P)—Two hundred miles of the Rich Texas coastal country were battended down late tonight in preparation for a tropical storm that sneaked close to the shoreline before being discovered by ever alert weather observers.

Th weather bureau in a 9:30 p. m. advisory described the disturbance as a tropical storm whirling off the Texas coast over the Gulf of Mexico which might reach hurricane proportions before striking the coast near Galveston about midnight. (Wilmington time would be two a. m., Sunday.)
