First Presbyterian To Open Kindergarten September 29

Continuing its progress made in youth education in the past two years, the First Presbyterian church will open its kindergarten under the direction of Mrs. Charles D. King and Miss Bacon McKoy September 29.
 Preferences in enrolling will be given to children of the First Presbyterian church until Sunday, September 7. Other children may register now and be placed on a waiting list to be enrolled after that date.
 The school will be open Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. until 12 noon, and the enrollment is limited to children aged four and five years.
 The curriculum will be planned as a cooperative responsibility between the teachers and the church staff to provide christian training for mind and body and to give children an opportunity to express themselves creatively through such materials as finger paints, crayons, and clay. Through association with other children of their own age, the church education staff believes that they will develop resourcefulness, initiative and muscular control.
 Daily lessons in appreciation of good music will be given and Edwin D. Clark, organist will conduct regular choir practice. Light refreshments will be served daily.
 The enclosed out-of-door court is

one of the fine assets of the kindergarten, equipped with swings, slide, sand box and ample room for play.
 A fee of \$10 monthly will be charged parents with \$2 extra for equipment the first month.

 The wedding took place August 13, at 4 o'clock in the Zion Methodist parsonage. The Rev. Walter B. Gregory, pastor of the church officiated.

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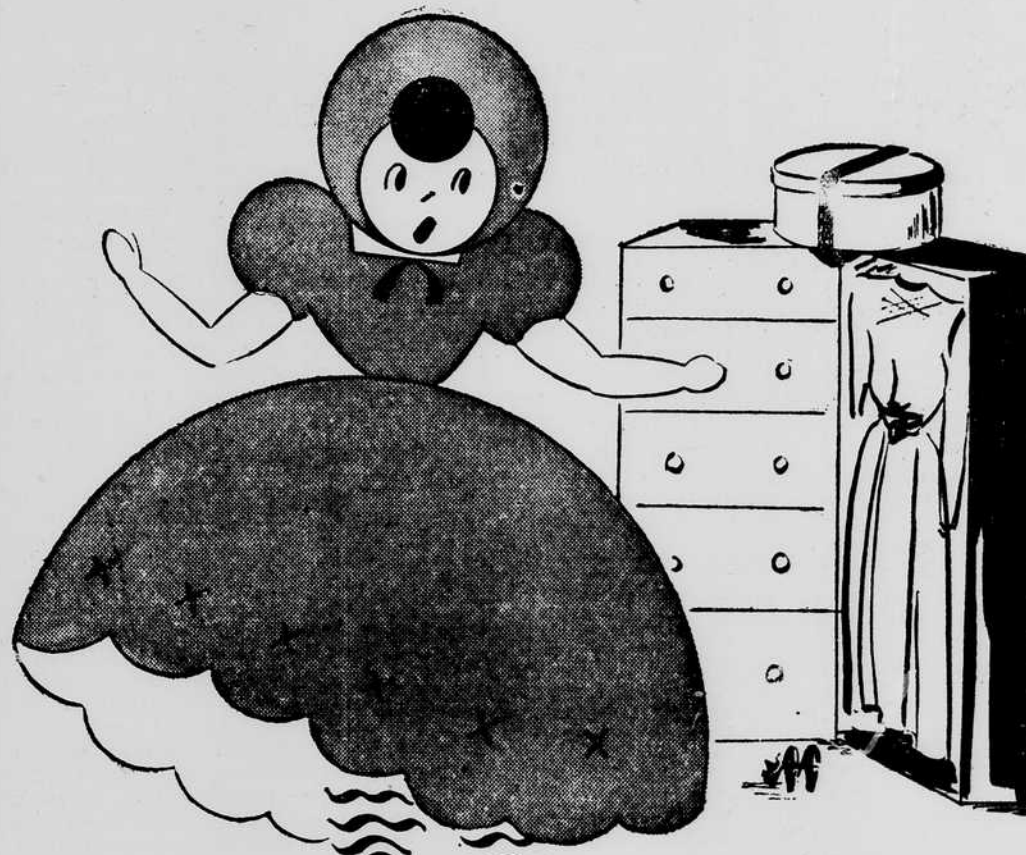
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
