DR. ELLIOT TAKES EXCEPTION TO NEW DAIRY ORDINANCE

Dr. A. H. Elliot, city-county health director, yesterday took exception to the new state dairy standard ordinance.

Predicting that the law, which becomes effective September 1, will be changed, Dr. Elliot declared that it "puts too much stress on the technical points of the dairy barn and not enough on the actual purity of the milk."

He added that low grade milk can make from poor "A" barns as well as from good barns. The new law requires that all bottled milk have a bacteria count of not less than 200,000 per cubic centimeter before pasteurization.

LAKE WACCAMAW BOAT RACES SET

Drivers From Five States Enter Event Slated For Sunday Afternoon

Special To The Star WHITEVILLE, August 26.—Speed demons from five states will be present when the opening flag goes down on the annual outboard motor boat races at Lake Waccamaw on Sunday, August 31.

Some of the finest and highly rated speedsters in the South will be competing for \$600 in cash money that is being offered by the sponsors of the event, the Lake Waccamaw Lions Club.

The races are scheduled to begin at 10 o'clock in the morning and continue until 4 o'clock in the afternoon with 7 different classes competing for the awards. The entry blanks have been pouring into the entry committee, headed by Fred Goldston, with an expected goal of fifty racers set to go at the starting line.

The classes will include: runabouts, hydroplanes, and a "free-for-all" climax. The runabouts and hydroplanes will be classed in A, B, and C, categories to even the races, both in competition and skill. All races will be started by clock and flag.

Such nationally known racers as, Louis Patterson, Bob Rowland, Mabry Edwards, and Claude Smith will compete in the hydroplane classes with top speed better than 60 miles per hour. From the Wilmington circle will come, Johnson, Cofer, Bell, Willetts, Abrams, and Wilson to add to talented list of contestants.

Several fast drivers from New Bern have also been contacted. The ranking speaker in this group will be J. J. Arthur, who has taken top honors in various races all through the Southeast. The course is to be from Weaver's pier to Harry's Anchorage with the race committee scheduling the run to be as close to shore as possible. The boats that the

racers drive are of light weight and the spills and thrills are fast and often.

Carl Pennington of Wilmington will be in charge of the pits and Gil Pickard, also of Wilmington, and Fred Goldston will do the starting and judging. All of the drivers are expected to enter the races at White Lake, which will be held on Monday.
