(Continued from Page One) Both the United States and Russia, throughout the Assembly session, have hounded each other at every turn, even when the only possible achievement could be discrediting the other in the eyes of the world.

The revived Communist International will enable Moscow to coordinate still better its propaganda and political campaigns, both inside and outside UN.

Of the nine countries which will send delegates to the International, five are UN members — Russia, Yugoslavia, Poland, Czechoslovakia and France.

The membership application of Italy was vetoed by Russia, while the Western nations while the applications of the other three countries in the International — Bulgaria, Romania and Hungary.

The Moscow declaration welding the nine countries into the International asked them to stand "firm and solid" against the Western powers, until the Western designs collapse.

BEER—America's Beverage of Moderation. What The LAW Requires. The question is sometimes raised as to what the law requires of retail beer dealers. Here are the principal requirements for those who sell malt beverages for consumption on the premises, as condensed from the North Carolina Beverage Control Act of 1939, as amended: To obtain a retail beer license, one must show: 1. That he is over 21 years old and has been a resident of the State and a citizen of the United States for one year or more. 2. That he has not been convicted of a felony or other crime involving moral turpitude or adjudged guilty of violating the prohibition laws within two years. 3. That he intends to carry on the business for himself or under his immediate supervision and direction. To carry his license, a retail dealer must not: 1. Knowingly sell malt beverages to anyone under 18 years of age. 2. Knowingly sell such beverages to intoxicated persons. 3. Sell such beverage outside the legal hours. 4. Permit disorderly conduct, improper or immoral entertainment, conduct or practices on premises. 5. Sell, offer for sale, process or permit the consumption on the licensed premises of any alcoholic liquors not authorized under his license. These are the fundamental points of the North Carolina code for beer dealers. This Committee heartily endorses every one of these requirements and through our Self-Regulation Program we feel that we have accomplished much toward bringing about their acceptance and observance by the great majority of beer dealers in North Carolina. For complete legal details regarding the sale of beer, one should refer to the law itself, a copy of which can be obtained free of charge from the Committee's Raleigh office.
