NEW YORK, Nov. 28-(AP)surprise compromise move by France today put off for at least 24 hours a final showdown vote in the United Nations Assembly on the so-called Soviet-American plan to partition Palestine into Jewish and Arabic countries.

The Assembly voted 25 to 15

on the simple question of adjourning for 24 hours.

A motion for adjournment takes precedence over all other business, must be voted on promptly, and requires only a

simple majority for adoption. Alexandre Parodi, chief French delegate, proposed the postponement with the avowed hope that some "good-will formula" might be found in those hours to end the Arab-Jew impasse. Arab countries are bitterly opposed to partition; Zionist Jews favor it.

When the Assembly reconvenes tomorrow at 4 p. m. (EST) it must also consider a surprise move by Colombia which would in effect delay a final decision on Palestine until sometime next
