FOREIGN POLICY URGED ON CHURCH

Bishop Oxnam Asks Methodist To Take More Active Part

BUCK HILL FALLS, Pa., Dec. 11.—(AP)—Bishop G. Bromley Oxnam of New York today urged the Methodist church to take a more active part in formulating the country's foreign policies by "providing competent men to represent the moral opinion of the world at the places where decisions are made."
"Unfortunately we have largely waited until decisions are made and then protested them," Bishop Oxnam told delegates to the annual session of the board of missions and church extension. "Protests don't build constructive programs. There should be a flow of opinion to the White House from all groups—Protestants, Jewish and Catholic alike."
He cited partition of the Holy Land as an example of the inarticulateness of his church. "The very complexities of the partition left us silent. We were not prepared to recommend any action."
A step toward preparing the church for a more informed voice in world policy decision was taken this year, he said, with the appointment of the Rev. Garland Evans Hopkins as associate secretary for the relation of business and government to missions. Hopkins made a comprehensive report to the board based upon his visits to the Arabic world, India, Southwest Asia and the occupied areas of the Far East, including Okinawa, Japan and Korea.
"As far as the rest of the world is concerned," Hopkins reported "whatever the foreign policy of America or any of the other of the west nations may be, it is a Christian foreign policy."
It is therefore, essential that Christians more actively influence the policies of the nations in which we are dominant, or clearly disassociate ourselves from the policies of these nations."

City Briefs
Official figures showed yesterday that Wilmington topped all cities in North Carolina and Virginia, with the exception of Charlotte, in actual visitations of the Freedom Train which arrived and left here Wednesday. A total of 10,002 persons from Southeastern North Carolina visited the train to view the historical documents and treaties.
A display of an iron lung in the downtown section of Wilmington will begin Dec. 15 and continue until Dec. 24 for the purpose of collecting funds for the purchase of two Mullikin portable iron lungs which cost \$1,500 each, and to be used by the city fire and police departments.
William Hill was named chairman of a committee to study the rent control system in Wilmington at a meeting held yesterday of the Board of Realtors.

CHICAGO (AP) — Leonard Keeler, president of the newly-founded International Society for the Detection of Deception, has chosen Chicago as headquarters for scientific crime detection.

SEAL SALE GOAL NEAR 20 PERCENT

Only 14 Days Before Campaign Comes To Close; Contributions Lagging

WHITEVILLE, Dec. 11—Approximately 700 which represents 20 per cent of Columbus county's goal of \$3,500 was reported today by the office of the Christmas Seal Sale Committee.
With only 14 more days until the campaign comes to a close, members of the committee said the present rate of contributions, if it continues, would place the total at less than half of what will be necessary to inaugurate a campaign against tuberculosis with any chance of success.
However, the bangle campaign now in progress in the white schools and the vigorous drive inaugurated this week among the colored population of the county are expected to swell the sales.
Willard G. Cole, chairman of the seal sale committee reiterated his appeal for a generous response to the letters which have gone out. "Buy the seals which were enclosed in the letter and each of you will share in the expanded program which will mean so much in the battle with this dreaded killer of man kind," he said.
Local committeemen in each of the school districts are now conducting the bangle sales.
J. W. Campbell, principal of the Whiteville Negro schools, is heading the Seal Sales among the colored people. He started off the drive with a radio address over WENC Monday and has already received encouraging reports with respect to reaching the goal of \$300 which was set as the quota for the Negro people of the county.
The success or failure of the countywide effort to carry on the tuberculosis battle will be determined within the next few days, Seal Sale committeemen said.
