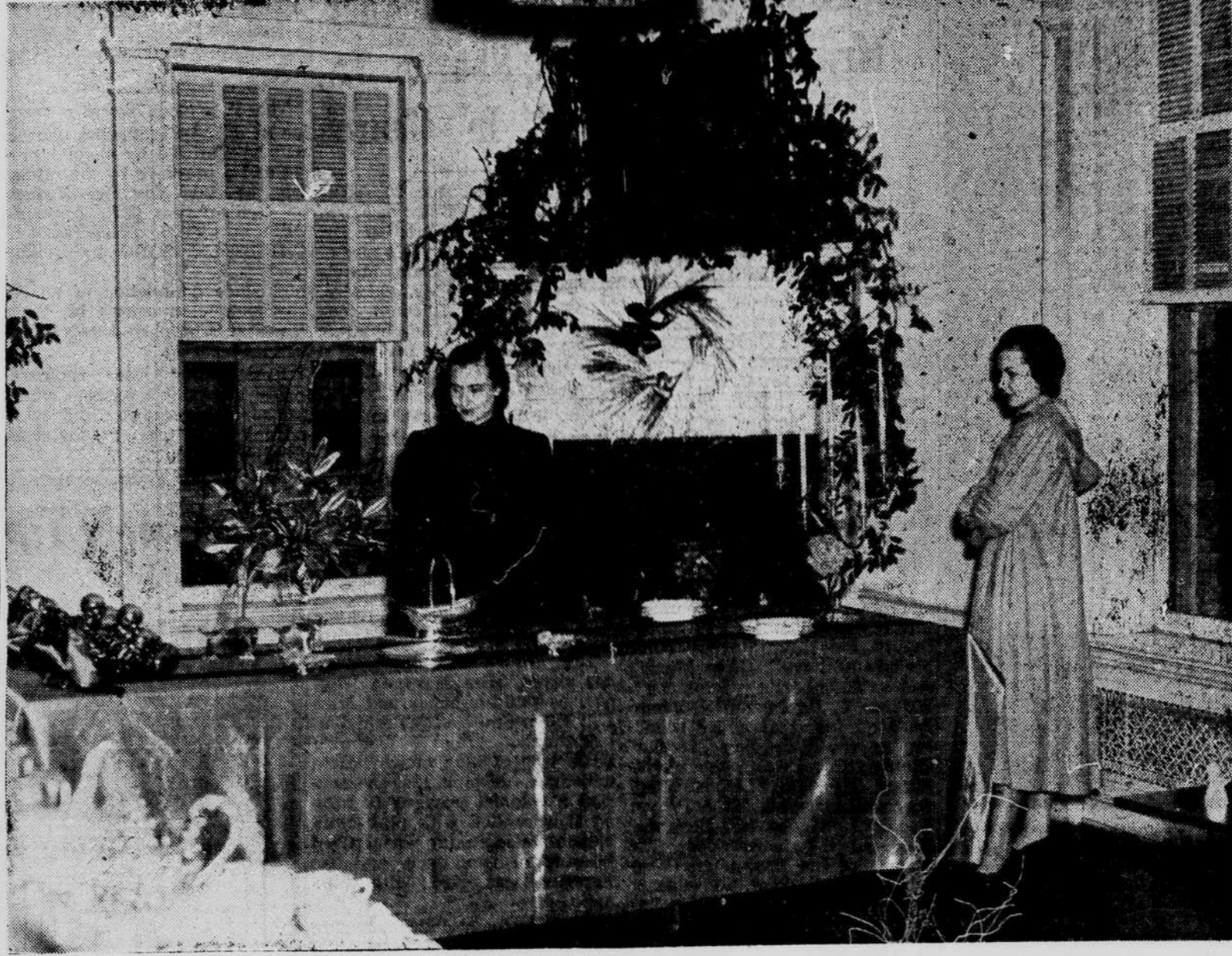

Mrs. Gupton Named To National Council

W.O.M.A.N. — World Organization of Mothers of All Nations, Inc., of which Dorothy Thompson is chairman, has honored itself and the North Carolina Federation of Women's clubs by appointing Mrs. James A. Gupton of Charlotte, a member of its national council. This council is to serve until such time as a convention can be held and a permanent council elected.

Mrs. Gupton was chosen for this council because of the leadership she has already shown in the peace movement, in the organization of which she is president, the theme of her administration being "United for Peace." She and the chairman of the International Relations department, Mrs. Gordon Madrey, keep alert to every opportunity to lead the North Carolina

clubwomen in cooperation with all other women working for world peace. Full information about the organization W.O.M.A.N. will go to the clubs early in January.

With Mrs. Gupton helping to formulate and direct the plan of work, W.O.M.A.N. begins in North Carolina with favor and impetus. The abbreviated name of the organization is perfect, and is made up of the capitals in the full name, World Organization of Mothers of All Nations.

From Mrs. T. Fred Henry, Federation treasurer, comes this satisfying report: "I sent a check for \$1,033 today to the Near East foundation as a gift from our clubs for Christmas Cheer for the Greek children. Isn't that excellent?" It is indeed. The call for contributions for a Christmas Cheer fund for the Greek children was mailed to clubs on November 15, and it appeared in newspapers on December 7, with the 10th as date named for sending the total to the Near East Foundation. Each response is typical of the best with which the clubs respond to calls from their State president and the department chairman. Many of the clubs simply took a collection at the December meeting. Others had some benefit affair, and still others made the contribution from the club treasury.

The Spray Woman's club, the Junior Woman's club of Leaksville, the Leaksville-Spray History club, the Thursday club, the Senior Study club both of Leaksville, the Venie J. Weaver club of Spray, and the Draper Woman's club raised \$100 at a joint party for the Greek fund. Potter-Bullock Vows Announced

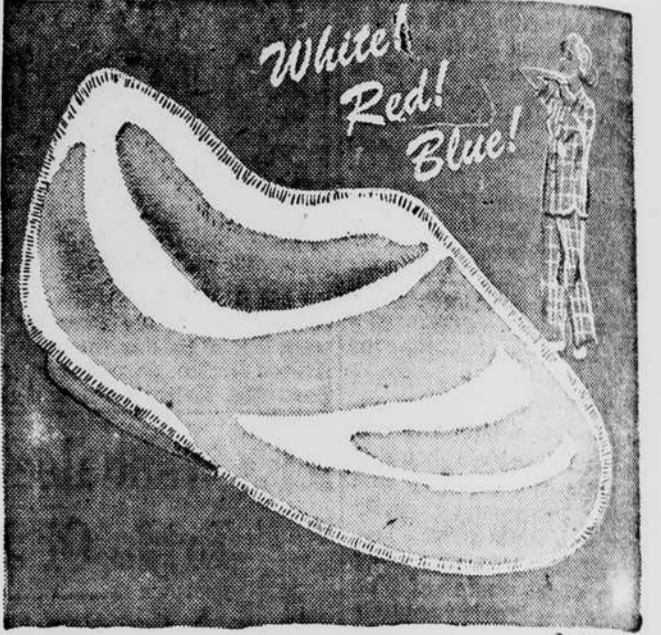
