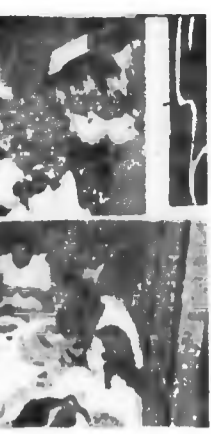

Since pressure was put on the "Secret War" more time ago to release all servicemen who were discharged on condition that they had no training in this type of work and as a result they had the man who was asked to be separated from the service, just anything to make him feel good, such that he has never having to work at the price he could get it and finally that he did not have to accept any work at all or long as he could get the \$20 per week adjustment allowance.

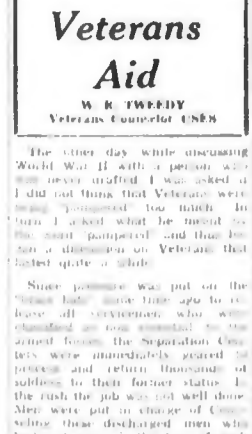
Many soldiers naturally swallowed this type of advice, and when they arrived home, expected to find the bright picture just painted for him at the Separation Center. Now a man who had served his country during its crisis and had the misfortune of being mis-educated at the Separation Center needs a special period in which he might forget war and time to see that the picture painted when he was discharged was not a mirage of a dream.

After all most people who were not called into service for their country were pampered and in no small degree during the war. These were common laborers who had never earned more than 40c per hour who were might changed the term from common laborer to laborer, and had to be given the 40c per hour for no more work than was done when he was a laborer at 40c. He did not pamper thousands of workers who through greed to strike and stop the production of guns and ammunition of war did not meet their demands. Are we not still "pampered" after the war who threaten to undermine our whole economic set up.
