Young Harris told reporters at a press conference held at NAACP offices in New York's Freedom House, the horrifying details of his ordeal in the Louisiana woods. His description of returning consciousness and hearing Veteran John Jones groan for water left seasoned reporters shocked and silent.

MAYOR GETS PLAN FOR IMPROVING CITY SCHOOLS... a long range program of improvements in the colored schools of Raleigh.

Save Your Waste Fat!... The sub-committee, speaking for the colored citizens of the city, proposes the following areas for improvements in keeping with school standards set up for progressive communities in the southern states.

1. Each community school should provide an adequate cafeteria to assure each child of a balanced lunch served under proper sanitary conditions.

2. Playground space around each community school should be adequate to allow organized and free play at recess and after-school hours without congestion and with necessary separation of larger and smaller children's groups.

3. Adequate planning for the whole school plant is necessary to prevent shortages of facilities. Broad policy commitments on the part of the school board will be necessary to assure the citizens of the city that budget economics, vested interests in class-room competition, and short-sighted administrative policy will not result in inadequate and hardly improvable school plants.

curriculum and the responsibility for its promotion should be a matter of school board policy. A gymnasium is a necessary part of every modern community school. We urge the adoption of such a policy to equal existing school and the inclusion of such a facility in each new school to be built in a community of the city.

5. The environment of the present high school for colored children is definitely unsatisfactory. Some definite action is desirable to remedy this situation. The people as a whole, whose children must attend the high school should be represented in any planning for the future of the high school and its program.

6. The Sub-committee on educational problems, representing the Negro Citizens' Committee recommends that the following steps be taken to assure all communities and groups of citizens of the city of Raleigh of adequate representation in the deliberations of the city school board when the policies and programs are developed and projected.

A. Fencing the time when colored citizens in ratio to the colored population can be appointed to fill vacancies occurring in the membership of the school board, we propose:

I. That an advisory committee of colored citizens be appointed by the city commissioners to act with the school board in all policy making decisions, such committee to consist of not less than three persons representing professional, business, and laymen's groups.

II. That the advisory committee be retained until the ratio of colored members of the school board equals, to the nearest major fraction, the population ratio of colored citizens in the city of Raleigh.

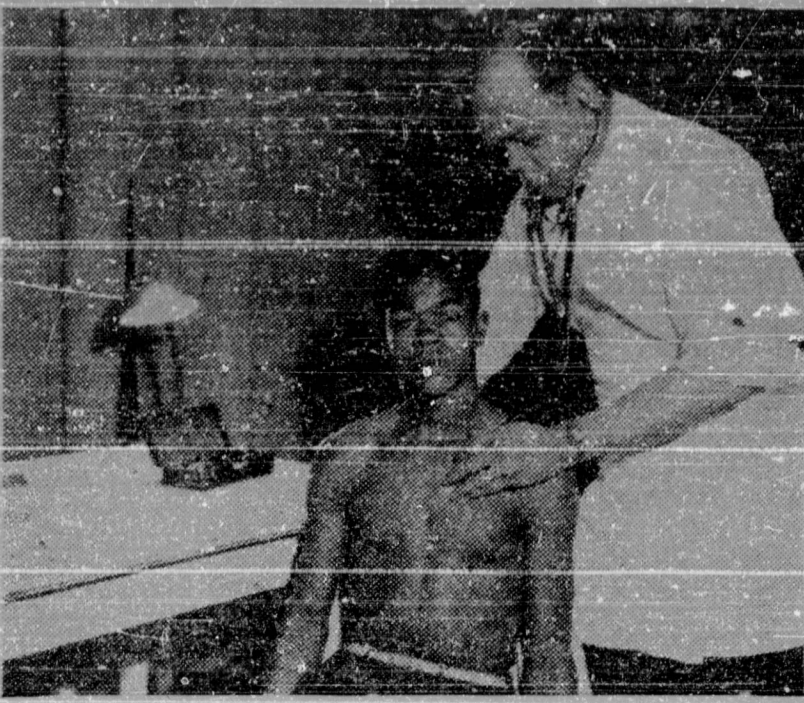
III. That the advisory committee be continued for only as long as it is impossible to fill vacancies in the membership of the school board with colored members in ratio to colored population.

IV. That all candidates for either the advisory committee or membership on the regularly constituted school board be approved by the Negro Citizens' Committee before appointment.

SENATE BLOC STATE RIGHTS... Recent lynchings have added emphasis to the urgent necessity of a federal anti-lynching bill.

Federal legislation is vital if the authority and influence of the Federal Government is to be utilized in wiping out crimes of this heinous character.

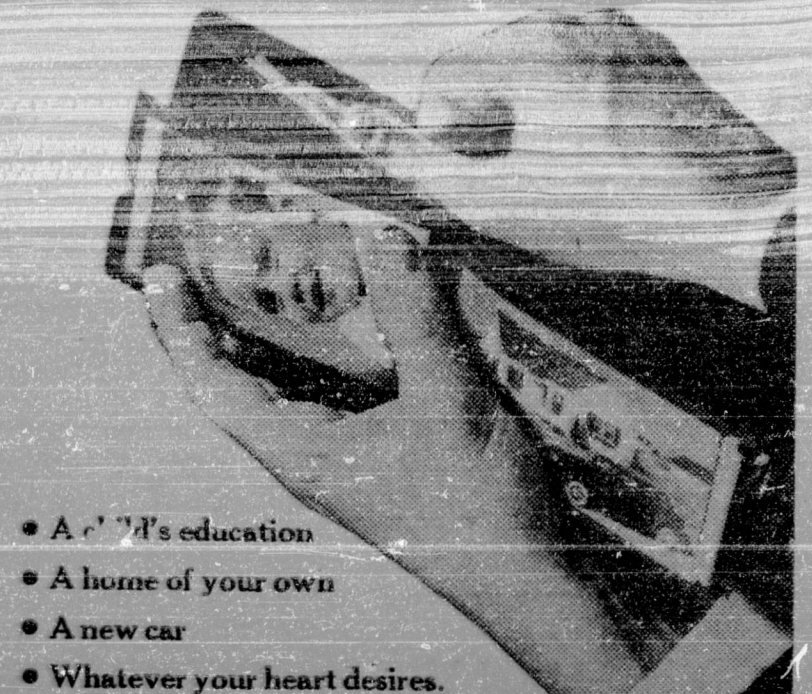

N. C. COLLEGES GET HOUSING UNIT

WASHINGTON — A total of 334 housing units have been allotted to North Carolina colleges for use of veterans under the Landon act.

The Federal Public Housing Agency reported here Friday. Only 4,833 of the total of 102,753 units allotted to 675 schools for veterans were allotted to Negro institutions the report shows, with only 33 institutions granted units.

North Carolina institutions allotted units are as follows: Johnson C. Smith, 34; North Carolina College, 24; Elizabeth City State Teachers College, 36; and A and T. C. Dige, 26; and Fayetteville State Teachers College, 20.
