

Hamp Thrills Coast Fans

HOLLYWOOD—A "Hamp Fantasy", a distinct advancement in the modern mood of music which keyed a theme of world peace and unity, was presented by the Lionel Hampton orchestra for the first time at the annual "Coke" Jazz at Wrigley Field "under the stars" Saturday night. Over 15,000 persons attended.

Noted for his inebriated showmanship and powerful ensemble, the Hamp is presently leading the largest straight jazz band in the country. He features two basses, two guitarists, six trumpeters and four trombonists. In addition, there is Milton Eckner at the piano, an-

other drummer, five saxophonists and, of course, Hampton's own drums and voice.

There is only one thing that the Hamp may add a kind of a twist to the crowd emotion for, and that is to serve as a model for the older all to effect in a mood of unadulterated enthusiasm. The Hamp is not only a great musician, but he is also a great showman. He appeared with distinction in the pit at Carnegie hall in New York, at the Bluebird in Pittsburgh, Detroit, and Boston. Symphonies and orchestras are organized by a radio station composed of 25 members of his own band.

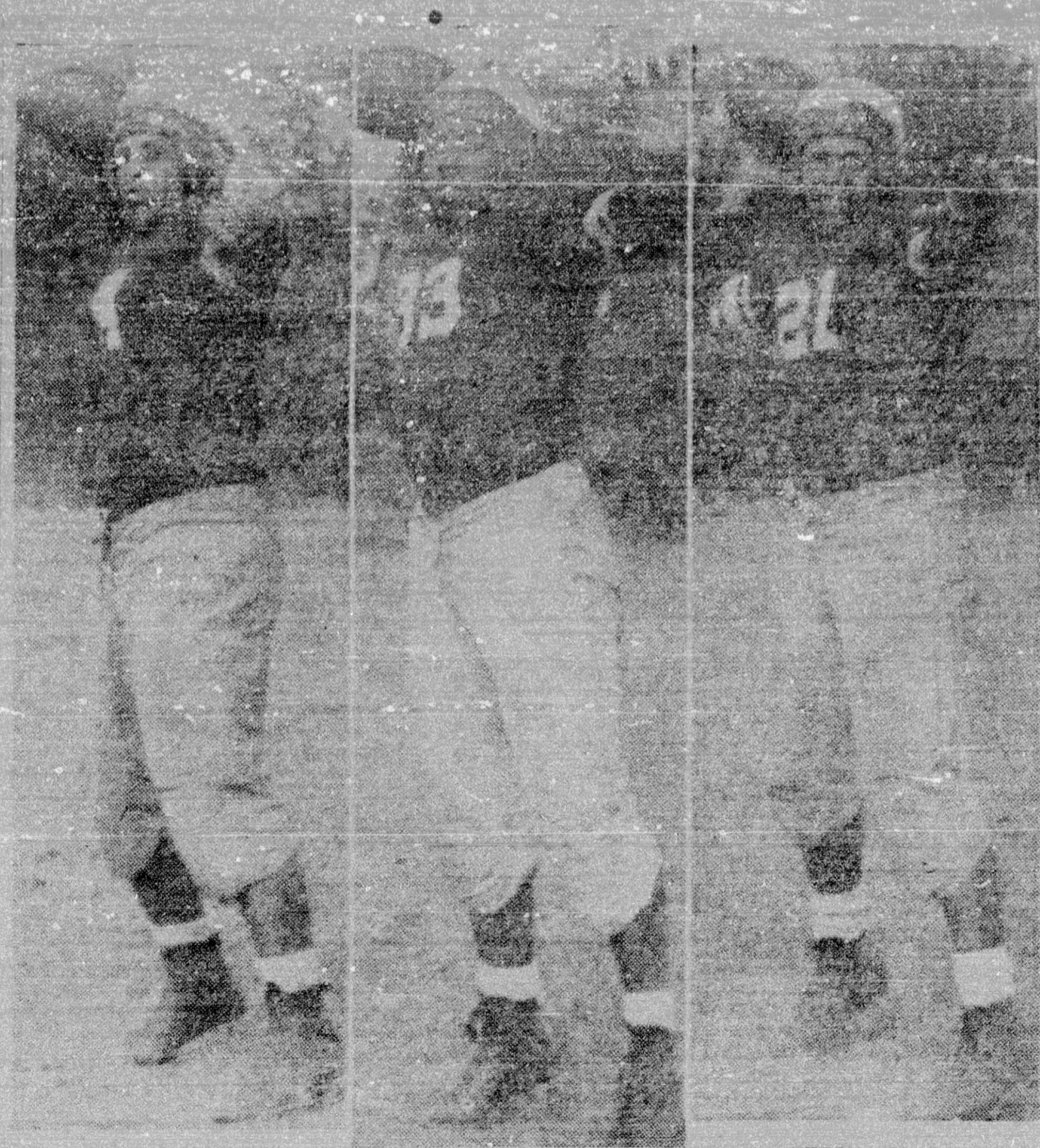

Henderson's Comments

Percy L. Jacobs, veteran coach and physical education teacher at Durham High School in Washington, D. C., passed 95 years suddenly at the end of a practice cross country run on Tuesday, October 15.

Percy was one of the "old timers." He graduated from Lincoln University in 1910 and during his student days was a member of the football team. In 1935, he secured his master's degree from Columbia University.

His professional work began in Kansas where he taught. He came to Washington in 1929 and was assigned to George Washington Junior High School. In 1929 he took over a physical education teaching position at Dunbar High School, which he held until his death. He coached at times baseball, basketball, track and golf teams. He planned to coach the latter three sports this year.

"Joke" as we know him, was a sweet, friendly, a great sport, an indefatigable worker and tremendously interested in his work. As head of the Department of Health, Physical Education and Safety, it is my candid opinion that Percy Jacobs was the most professionally and a great teacher I have ever known. There has hardly been a sunny day since "Joke" was appointed that he has not gone to summer school or taken a coaching course.

He attended basketball and baseball clinics all around the country from the western colleges to those in the east. He would take courses in psychology at different universities to better understand and be able to handle the problems of the boys. Then, he would take a course in photography in order to make better films of his boys.

He loved his boys. It was not a hardship to meet them, including evenings or Saturday in all seasons. Lately he was proud of the progress his cross country team were making. Last year, he produced a winning team and one boy, "Bruce" was an across champion. This year "John" was buoyant with hope for the success of the program he had planned.

We were with him in the closing hours of his life, never realizing the end was so near. We started a practice cross country run which

He will be missed greatly by the South Atlantic High School Athletic Conference, for which he served as publicity agent since its beginning in 1929. He was a valued member of the Eastern Board of Officers of the Columbia Coaches' Association and other civic and educational organizations. An ardent cyclist, his influence was good and far-reaching. The schools and the sports groups have had a fine gentleman and inspiring coach and a scholar.
