PRELATES ACT AGAINST J. G.

SOUTH BEND Ind. — All people eat one common food at a common table when they receive Communion in religious services, and they do violence to themselves and to their faith if they discriminate against Negroes in restaurants and in economic life, Messrs. Raymond Hillenbrand, specially-named Chicago prelate, declared in a recent address at Notre Dame University.

With the Catholic service of "Holy Communion," in which the body and blood of Christ itself is eaten, particularly in mind, Messrs. Hillenbrand called for greater practice in daily life of the social principles of racial justice inherent in true religion.

"Discriminatory individualism must die when we go back to learn what our fathers knew — the unity of sacrifice on the altar," Messrs. Hillenbrand asserted.

He pointed out that in the Catholic service of the Mass, of which Holy Communion is properly a part, the priest and people together offer Christ as a common sacrifice to God the Father. With this offering they offer also their own hearts in union with the whole human race, and this joint offering constitutes a principle of racial unity which must go beyond the church and pervade every phase of our social and economic life, he said.
