Sister Gary Preaches Final Conference Year Sermon

An overflow crowd assembled at Grace Chapel AME Zion Church last Sunday night to hear their pastor, the Rev. Sister Gary, preach on the subject, "The Church in the Year of the Lord." Sister Gary, who has been preaching at Grace Chapel since 1938, delivered her sermon on the subject, "The Church in the Year of the Lord." She urged her people to follow the path of the Church in the Year of the Lord, and to be faithful to the teachings of the Bible. The services were opened with the very familiar "He Brought Me Here." The report of the year, "The Lord Has Made Me Free," rendered by the choir was sung for the first time since the Rev. Sister Gary's arrival at Grace Chapel. The choir, under the direction of Mrs. J. H. Garrett, sang beautifully.

Just for short years ago Sister Gary was assigned to this humble work. Here she found twelve members, seven pupils for Sunday School, a piano and a piano not to mention a very small dilapidated edifice to house the spiritually unceremonious. Believing in human values, she saw great possibilities and started at once a major movement, broken down in short term goals. Kerosene lamps were replaced by electricity, kerosene stoves replaced by electric ones, and the church was transformed into a modern building.

Her years work this year seem well worth while, for in addition to building up the spiritual side of the church, having held a soul stirring revival and having received many members into the church, the financial condition of the church is beyond reproach.

Noteworthy among her achievements for the year is a paid broadcast each Sunday night. That program bought and paid for at a cost of \$1600 - a parsonage built and owned by the church on E. Lane St.; the minister's salary of \$1500; visiting ministers received, \$300; the Equi-Centennial \$100. A total of all money raised this year at Grace was nearly seven thousand dollars. At the close of the meeting Tuesday night, Sister Gary read the record of receipts and disbursements and thanked all of the members for their support.

The church at present has an Assistant Minister, Miss Dorothy Elam, four choirs, and twelve other organizations. The AME Zion Conference meets in Duane, N. C. this week. Sister Gary stated that she would be back.
