ACCIDENT FATAL TO LOCAL MAN

Raleigh — The death toll in a highway accident 12 miles south of here Saturday night rose to two Sunday when Len Holland of 324 W. South Street died at 1:50 p. m. from a severe skull injury and internal lacerations in St. Agnes hospital.

Already dead was Miss Bertha Hayward, 323 W. South Street, who was instantly killed when the coupe in which she, Holland and three other men were riding sideswiped the front of another car, careened into a ditch and overturned twice.

Thomas Harvey of Garner, Route 1, and his brother, Herbert, 16, were still in serious condition at St. Agnes hospital Sunday night as a result of the accident.

Thomas Harvey who was driving at the time of the accident, according to investigating officers, is suffering from a severe cut on the left side of his face, a possible fracture of the jaw and internal injuries. Herbert Harvey sustained a neck injury, two fractures of the right leg and a severe skull injury. Jack Harris of 724 W. South Street escaped with only minor injuries.

The car struck the rear fender of another one driven by John H. Sherman, white man of Greensboro, Route 3, below striking the engine and overturning. Sherman was not injured, but officers said damage to the car amounted to \$5.

Miss Hayward was thrown 82 feet from the point of collision when the car struck the embankment, according to officers who said Thomas Harvey would be charged with manslaughter, carelessness and reckless driving and driving under influence of intoxication as soon as he recovers.
