MAID TELLS OF 30 YEARS SLAVERY... which took place four years after she had come to work for the woman as her maid.

A story of years of unpaid drudgery was unfolded in the prosecution, it was reported. Miss Jones said she started her day at 4:30 p. m. and worked until 10 p. m., cooking, cleaning, laundering and doing other household work.

"My last vacation was about 20 years when I went to visit my mother and spent about three weeks with her," she is reported to have said.

"When members of my family or friends come to see me, I was not allowed to meet them. I was forbidden to speak to any one except members of the household."

Mrs. Ingalls daughter, 27-year-old Mrs. Richard M. Roberts, also appeared before the grand jury. Earlier she had testified that first outside news of the slavery being practiced by the Ingalls came when she made a complaint to police last October.
