MINORITY VETERANS VICTIMS OF BIAS

By James I. Hiska WASHINGTON, D. C. (NNPA) — Veterans of minority groups are becoming impatient and bitter over the restrictions which they face because of their race, color, and creed. Joseph F. Albright, special assistant to the veterans administrator, reported in General Order No. 10, last Thursday.

In a summary of his observations of minority veterans made on a thirty-eight day coast-to-coast tour, Albright reported that:

1. The overall rehabilitation picture as it relates to minority veterans is still far from being desirable, although it is evidencing signs of progress.

2. Continuity concern for minority veterans is noticeably bound up in community social attitudes, which, while tending themselves to improve, have not yet reached a state where the concern equals the consideration they deserve.

3. The effectiveness of the Veterans Administration's rehabilitation programs of employment, training, housing, and loans are being circumscribed by the scope of community cooperation.

Opportunities for training and employment of minority group veterans are limited to a varying degree in every one of the states which he visited, Albright reported. He said difficulties experienced by minority veterans closely paralleled the degree of community cooperation held for its minority groups.

The report stated that while types of discrimination varied, all minority veterans who have been employed in any form of activity.

Albright said employment services personnel had confidentially held him of various local agencies for "white Gentiles only". He said VA training facilities officers had repeatedly refused to him extensive difficulties in training placement for even eligible veterans of minority groups.

He said he had never been shown a single community or minority veterans who had been employed in any form of activity, but that on numerous occasions he had been told that the fact of the Northwest is above normal in looking after the welfare of its veterans, and cited Minneapolis, St. Paul and Denver as other cities where he found commendably in helping their minority veterans.

Some states have failed him to indicate what they hold on to his progress and to make local interest in minority groups would apply to an unresponsive interest in the veterans of these groups, Albright said.
