

SALISBURY - Mrs. Lula S. Kelsly, of Salisbury, who was president emeritus of the N. C. Federation of Woman's Clubs, a state-wide civic and welfare organization died at her horse on Wednesday following a lengthy illness.

Mrs. Kelsey gave unstintingly of her efforts with the Woman's Curb which has labored for the past 25 years to improve the status of Negroes of North Carolina. Under her denamic leadership, this organization was responsible for the establishment of the N. C Training School for Negro Girls at Rocky Mount

She was a graduate of Burber-Scotia Junior College, a member of the AMEZ Church and one of the most outstanding civic and social welfare leaders in N. C., also, she was the first woman embalmer, white or relored, in the state, and at the time of her death was the director of the Kelsey-Noble Funeral Home in Salis-
