Accompanied by an engineer, the youthful general, piloted his own plane, an A-26 bomber, and landed at the Ohio Air Base shortly after 10:15 A. M. He was met on the tarmac by Col. Benjamin O. Davis, Jr., Base CO, several members of his staff, and Col. Maurice W. Reynolds, Staff Chaplain of TAC.

National Guard Urged To Accept Negroes

SAN FRANCISCO, Calif. — Demanding that all National Guard units be opened to qualified citizens regardless of race or color, the Regional NAACP office here has urged branches in the region to write or urge their governors in support of this stand.

Branches which have already responded include the Alameda County, Monterey, Santa Clara County and Salinas branches in California, the Okemah branch in Arizona and the Ogden branch in Utah.

The NAACP national office has

called upon the governors of New York and Connecticut to take immediate steps to see that all of their National Guard units upon reactivation, admit Negroes into their ranks.

NEGROES ACCORDED EQUAL TREATMENT AT GOP MEET

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) — Traditional jim-crow practices against Negroes here, flew out the window last week during the Twentieth Republican National committee meeting at the Hotel Neuhoff.

Contrary to a prediction made by Terry Howard, one of Mississippi's two Negro members of the GOP national committee, prior to the meeting here, Robinson R. (Bob) Church, of Memphis, attended all the luncheons and dinners held during the committee's stay. He was accepted as a guest at the Muehlebach hotel and occupied room No. 737.

During the meeting, Negro newsmen shared the same facilities along with white newsmen, were accorded equal treatment on the hotel's elevators and other accommodations. The next GOP national committee meeting will be held at Philadelphia in 1948.
