When questioned about the father, the girl readily admitted that he was a Negro and repeatedly told officials that she had not been raped. She insisted that she would raise her baby over the protest of officials and refused to be sent to a detention home.

Little effort has been made to hide the baby or hush up the Negro-white employees or patients. Negro patients and visitors have viewed the baby with several offering adoption. The mother refused all offers of adoption.

The Negro-white birth is the first here since the daughter of a wealthy and first family gave birth to a Negro baby 20 years ago. Hospital officials refused to officially comment for the press although they did not deny the widely talked about birth. The girl will be released from the hospital this week.

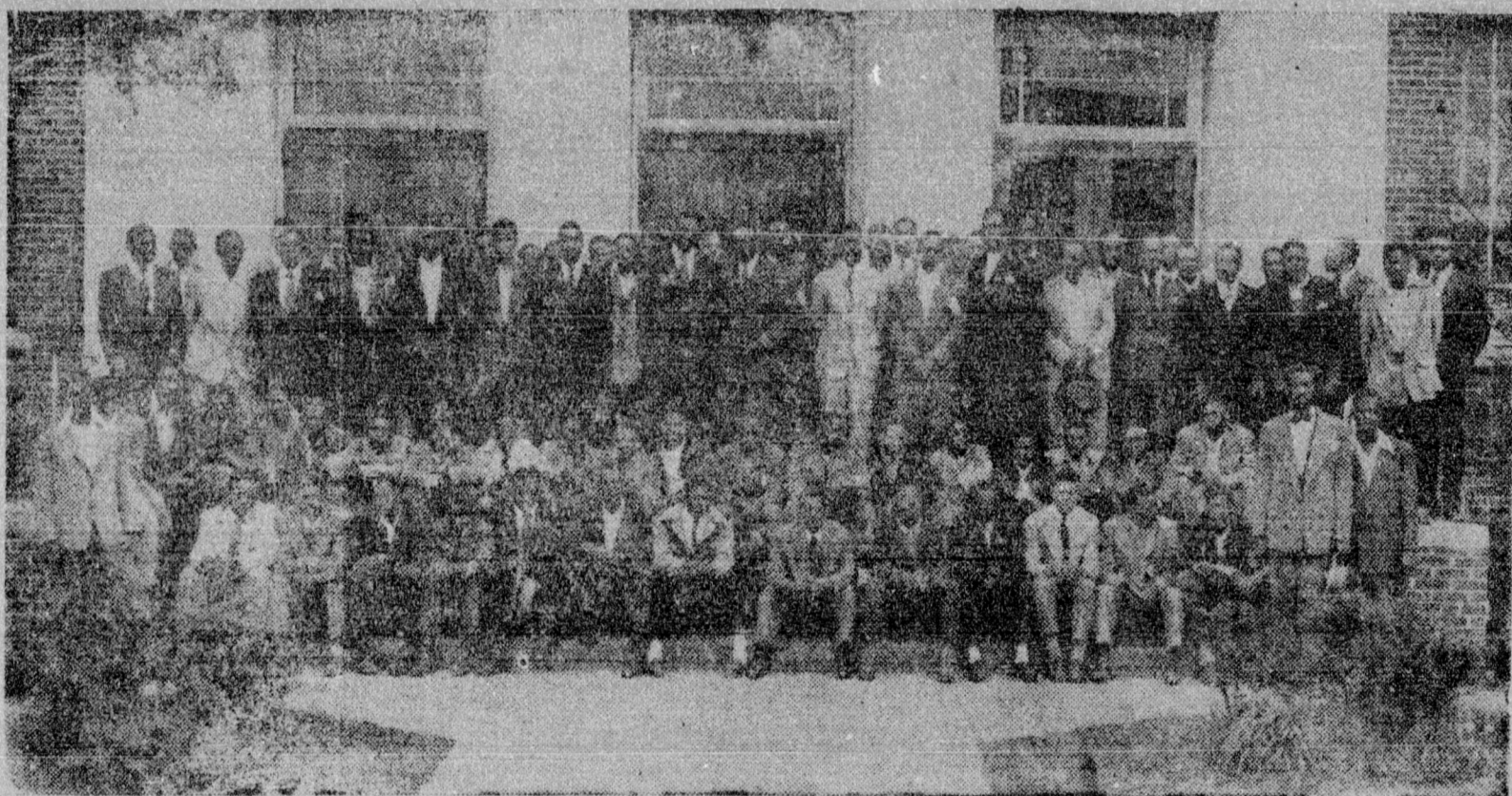
The 31 white men face charges of lynching Earle on February 17 after the 24-year-old youth had been arrested and confined to the county jail in connection with the fatal stabbing and robbing of a white taxi driver, and are charged with murder, conspiracy to commit murder, and being accessories before and after murder had been committed.

All were arrested in a whirlwind, four-day round-up after Earle was taken from the Pickens County jail and later beaten and shot to death across the county line in Greenville County.

Defense efforts to delay the trial were overruled last week by Judge J. Robert Martin, Jr., who ordered the case called at 10:00 a. m. Monday.

Coroner Irving M. Cheek who was investigating the case Monday said White died from an internal hemorrhage when he was fatally wounded from a shot from the high-powered rifle which struck him in the upper abdomen. He was wearing his working clothing at the time and had keys. It was later disclosed that he had access to the building at all times.

**Collier's Deplores Low Race Enrollment In Med Schools**

NEW YORK—Our Negro citizens are in acute need of medical attention but only 90 to 150 Negro doctors are graduated each year from our colleges, because most of our 67 medical schools bar Negroes completely. Only 8 to 10 are admitted each year to Northern and Western colleges.

This report is given by Albert Q. Maisel, medical writer, in a signed article in the current issue of Collier's. The article deplores discriminatory practices against Negroes and Jews and other factors which have resulted in a cut-back in the enrollment of medical students.

"Despite the tremendous need of our Negro citizens for medical care, our schools have been producing fewer and fewer Negro physicians," Maisel says. "The reason for the shrinkage is easily found. There are two colleges—Howard University and Meharry Medical College—which are primarily for Negroes.

the medical colleges other than Howard and Meharry."

Maisel charges that our medical schools, though they will not admit it, discriminate to "a lesser degree" against Jews. "Some class."

Maisel charges that the American Medical Association, which plays a "major role" in determining the policies of medical schools, has been influential in cutting back the enrollment of medical students in the postwar years. He points out the serious national need for more physicians.

"The American Medical Association has given the Education Development bill almost no support," Maisel adds. "This bill provides for federal aid in building hospitals and providing medical scholarships and is now pending in Congress."

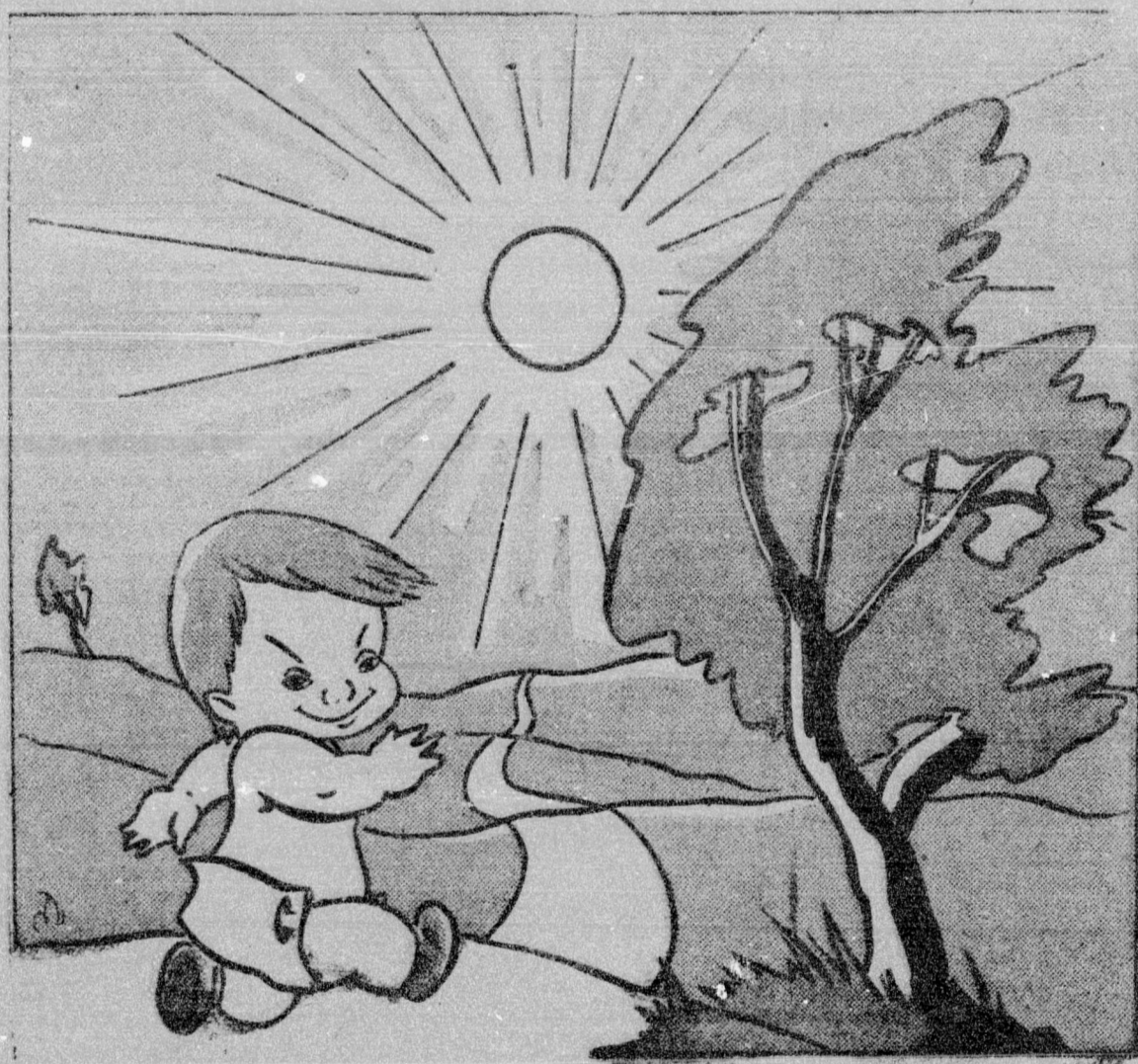
