

# PERRY HOWARD ASKS COLLINS' STAND ON "LILY WHITE" GOP

## REPUBLICAN IS CANDIDATE FOR BILBO VACANCY

Washington (NNPA) — Perry W. Howard, Republican national committee member for Mississippi, has demanded to know of L. B. Collins, a 76-year-old Spanish American War veteran and the Republican candidate to succeed the late Theodore G. Bilbo as United States Senator from Mississippi whether he is a "Lily White" or a "regular" Republican.

In a letter to Mr. Collins, Mr. Howard stated that he had endorsed him as the Republican candidate and had sought support of his candidacy from the American People's Party and the American Labor Party. Collins is one of six candidates for the Senatorial seat. The other five are Democrats.

### ONE SWIMS TO SAFETY AFTER BOAT CAPSIZES

Elizabeth City — Four men of the Newland section of Pasquotank county were drowned in the Discal Swamp Canal about 10 miles north of here Friday when the small row boat in which they were crossing the canal turned over, Sheriff M. D. Stevens of Camden county has reported.

George Koef, assistant fire chief, identified the men as Sutton Lovoy, William K. Bernard, John W. Adams and Milton Moore after the Elizabeth City Fire Department had dragged the canal and recovered all four of the bodies.
