AUSTIN, Texas (ANT) - The first and only student to enroll for legal training in Texas' segregated law school for Negroes registered for freshman courses here last week. The student is Henry Eman Dovle, former groccry store owner and school teacher

The Negro law school was set up last March in answer to a suit brought by Herman Marion Sweatt of Houston against the University of Texas for refusing to admit him as a law student Since its opening last March, no prospective students have enrelled. Sweatt contended in his suit that the segregated school does not afford equal opportuni-
