

Local Omegas End Achievement Week

RALEIGH — Achievement Week Activities of the Iota Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity were climaxed Sunday evening, November 9, an address by Dr. Luther Jackson, Professor of History at Virginia State College.

Among the men he particularly commended for having vigorously fought for constitutional and civil rights in regard to suffrage in southern states were John H. Mosley of South Carolina, A. T. Williams and John McGlothy of Georgia, Emory Jackson, John Lofton and J. E. Pearce of Alabama, C. Blythe Andrews of St. Petersburg, Florida, Percy Green of Mississippi, Daniel Byrd of Louisiana, R. R. Geovore and Lonnie Smith of Texas.

Dr. Jackson encouraged the audience to exercise their influence on others in getting citizens to vote, and stressed the fact that North Carolina was among the states that should have a large Negro vote in lieu of the fact that there is no poll tax.

Members of the Chapter observed that the program submitted by T. L. Spraggins, Chairman of the Social Action Committee for the year, was in line with Brother Jackson's contentions. A reception for Dr. Jackson was held after the program.

He became secretary of the YMAA in Bridgeport, Connecticut and later was associated with the President's Committee on Fair Employment Practices as an examiner. For many months he was acting examiner in charge of the New England region of the Fair Employment Practices Commission working in Boston. At the present time he is Administrative Assistant to the secretary of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

Building Contractor Wins High Post In Va.

SUFFOLK, Va. (AP) — William A. Lawrence, a building contractor, became the first Negro to be appointed to public office in Nansemond County since the post-Civil War period, when he was certified as elected to the board of supervisors by the county commissioners of election here last week.

Lawrence, an independent candidate from Cypress, registered district, won the post by a vote of 292 to 230 over rival candidate, Frank E. Harrell, white farmer and Democratic nominee.

Elbert L. King, 18, Route 1, Cameron, enlisted for three years unassigned European Theater and he states he plans to make the Army a career.

FDR's Boyhood Letters Published In Book Form

NEW YORK — "After my husband's death, my husband's secretary told me that in the little study which he always used when he was home there were a great many cardboard boxes," Eleanor Roosevelt writes in her Forward to FDR: HIS PERSONAL LETTERS, Early Years. "It was not until the spring of 1947 that I finally began to go through the boxes. Then I found that I had all or nearly all of the letters which my husband had ever written to his mother. . . ."

In 1887, at the age of five, Franklin Roosevelt wrote a letter to his mother. She kept it. For the next fifty-four years she added to her collection — schoolboy letters, casual notes, happy letters, letters detailing great events, and sometimes troubled letters. Because Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt felt that historic interest warranted the publication of these letters, she gave her permission.

Edited by Elliot Roosevelt, FDR: HIS PERSONAL LETTERS, Early Years includes all the letters from Mrs. James Roosevelt's collection from 1887 to 1904, when FDR was graduated from Harvard. Doubleday and Pennington published 20-

TWO RECEIVE AWARDS FROM CATHOLIC GROUP

NEW YORK — (Special) — Clarence T. Hunter, president of the Catholic Interracial Council of St. Louis, and Julian J. Reiss, former member of the New York State Commission Against Discrimination, were named by the Catholic Interracial Council to receive the James J. Hoey Awards for 1947 in recognition of their outstanding contribution to the cause of interracial justice during the past year.

The silver medals representing the awards were presented at the Carroll Club here.

The James J. Hoey Awards, conferred annually on a white and a Negro Catholic layman, were established in 1942 by the family of the late James J. Hoey, who was one of the organizers and first president of the Catholic Interracial Council.

Mr. Hunter, chosen to receive the honor this year, has been a teacher in St. Louis schools for 12 years and is now principal of Bancker School there. He is one of the charter members of the Catholic Interracial Council of St. Louis.
