

PRINCESS ANN TO GET 2 NEW BLDGS.

BALTIMORE (NNPA) — Construction of two buildings at Princess Ann College will go forward immediately, although Attorney General Hall Hamilton has ruled that the cost cannot be paid for by a merger of two appropriations for the 1947 general construction

H. C. Byrd, president of the University of Maryland, parent institution of Princess Ann, said last Friday he expected the buildings would be completed by next September, with supplemental funds from student fees.

\$200,000 was allowed for the dormitory, and \$150,000 for the classroom building. The low bid for the dormitory exceeded \$200,000.

The approval of the construction by the board followed an inspection trip by the Legislative Council had been requested by the board to visit the college in order to reach a decision regarding the portion of the Marbury report which recommended that Princess Ann be again placed under the control of Morgan College.
