Mo. Pays More In Segregating Law Students

ST. LOUIS (AP) — It costs \$100,000 more to segregate law students in Missouri than it does to train a white student at the University of Missouri, a recent study by the St. Louis Post-Dispatch revealed. According to the survey, the state spends \$807 a year to train a white law student, but only \$228 for a Negro student. Last year 277 whites and more than half that number, 135 Negroes, were admitted to the law school.
