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colleges and to secure an extended formal education, a special accelerated high school course is offered. In keeping with the vocational makeup of the community served, an "On The Farm" agricultural training program is provided. The third phase of the program is designed to meet the needs of those interested in the building trades, building maintenance or in other branches of the industrial arts. Although the school's regular high school program has been discontinued for the summer vacation, the veterans training program is continuing throughout the summer months. The vets' classes, other than those for the "on the farm" program begin at 4:15 in the afternoon and continue thru until 8:30 p. m. Quite a few of the students begin their classes at 4:30, others, however, who are employed or who have other duties, carry classes from 6:30 to 8:30. The school and the program are headed by Dr. Hermon S. Davis, who has served as its principal and executive since 1933. Faculty members who assist him in the conduct of the program include G. R. King, A. J. McGhee, J. W. Sanders, J. Elsie, Miss Esther Jordan, Mrs. W. Anderson and Mrs. M. W. Ghant.

THREE SCHOOLS

In this new assignment Lt. Col. Robinson will give special attention to the ROTC program in Negro Colleges. With the retirement of Brig. Gen. B. O. Davis in July, Col. Robinson, who has recently been recommended for promotion to Lieutenant Colonel in the Regular Army, will be the ranking Negro officer in the regular army. James C. Evans, civilian aide to the Secretary of Army and advisor to the secretary of defense, said "Increasingly the Negro youth is participating in three methods of obtaining a commission in the regular army: the U. S. Military Academy at West Point, the reserve officer's training corps program and the regular army competitive tour. "The ROTC program in colleges and universities throughout the country offers the college graduate an excellent basis for progress in a military career. At present more than 3,000 students are enrolled in the senior division, ROTC at nine Negro colleges and universities.

to ministers, said the purpose of this day is to ask "Almighty God to give these young men the strength to endure prison and the other difficulties that they shall face in that spirit which removes the occasion of violence and injustice. "For we are faced with possible prospects of hatred and violence unless young men who take such a stand do so with a real sense of humility and non-violence. Bayard Rustin, executive secretary of the league, indicated that ministers throughout the nation would be asked to advise, resist and the people of the United States to "consult God" in the matter of segregation in the armed forces. "We are asking ministers to urge all young men following the course of civil disobedience to remove hatred and bitterness from their hearts. Field representatives of the league are traveling all over the country setting up local organizations to coordinate the civil disobedience movement in particular communities. Thousands of pledges not to register for a Jim Crow Army, and buttons saying "Don't Join A Jim Crow Army," are being distributed. Court Issues Order Halting Refusal Of Right To Vote In S.C.

CHARLESTON, S. C. — Judge J. Walter Waring of the United States District Court, Eastern District of South Carolina, issued a restraining order Thursday in the suit filed by NAACP attorneys against 29 officers and members of the State's Democratic Party, who allegedly have sought to deprive Negroes of their race and color, according to the NAACP attorney. Such devices, the complaint claims, are in violation of Article I and Amendments Fourteen, Fifteen and Seventeen of the United States Constitution and of Section 31 and 43 of Title 2 of the United States Code. The restraining order issued today by Judge Waring asks both the defendants and the plaintiffs to appear in court July 16 to present both sides of the case. The attorneys handling the case for the NAACP are Special Counsel Thurgood Marshall and Assistant Special Counsel Edward R. Dudley of New York and Harold Boutwell of Columbia, South Carolina. In the latter case, Judge Waring held illegal the refusal of the Democratic Party of South Carolina to allow qualified Negroes the right to participate in the Democratic Party primary. Judge Waring's decision was sustained by the Fourth Circuit Court of Appeals and the United States Supreme Court refused last April, to review the decision.

Baptist Deacons To Meet In Connecticut

Washington (ANP) — The National Baptist Deacons' convention of America and the Women's auxiliary will hold their 14th annual session July 20-23 in New Haven, Conn. The theme of the meeting will be "Unity and the Christian Church." The meeting will be held at the Emmanuel Baptist Church, the Rev. William M. Hall, pastor. Deacon James Ross, president and founder of Washington, D. C., will address the group July 21. Mrs. Priscilla Ross, president of the auxiliary, will speak to the women. Dr. J. A. Jordan of Chester, Pa., will deliver the annual sermon, Arthur J. Adams, president of Empire State Baptist Layman's convention of New York, will also speak to the delegates. The Rev. William H. Hester of Boston will give a sermon July 22. The most unusual feature of the sessions will be the Sunrise Prayer meeting at 7 a. m. July 22. The Deacons' convention has temporary headquarters here at 464 Eye St., S. W. It has connections in 15 states, and will seek to double this number within the next five years.
