NDA MEETING TO FEATURE FILM ON NEGRO DENTISTS

CHICAGO (ANP) - A movie demonstrating the latest techniques in dentistry with Negro dentists in action will be one of the many features of the 35th annual meeting of the National Dental Association, it was revealed here this week.

The NDA meeting will be held in Newark August 8-13 at the Newark School of Fine and Industrial Arts.

Dr. Elliott C. Small, chairman of the visual education program, will show the film, "The Dentist in the Hospital," showing Negro dentists in activities at a modern hospital. Dr. William D. Giles, national vice president, produced the film. The scenes in the film were taken at Provident hospital in Chicago, the city long recognized by white and colored dentists as an outstanding center of dentistry.

Among other Chicagoans taking important roles in the coming convention are Dr. Joseph H. Plummer, national chairman of sports; Dr. William H. Wethers with a lecture on children's dentistry, and Dr. Maurice H. Hebert, a discourse on pyorrhea.

Other features of the convention program will be demonstrations, sports activities and a social program. The meeting will open with a radio broadcast by Doctor Russell A. Dixon, president-elect, Washington, Aug. 8 at 1 p.m.

Special sessions scheduled for the meeting are the periodontia session, 10 a.m., dental education, 2 p.m. and table clinics, 3 p.m., August 10; oral surgery, 10 a.m., and medical symposium, 2 p.m., August 11, and a series of table clinics, August 12 and 13.

Mayor Vincent J. Murphy of Newark will welcome the NDA at the public meeting, 8:30 p.m., August 10. Guest speaker at this meeting will be Harold A. Lett, chief assistant, division against discrimination, Department of Education of New Jersey. Dr. C. E. Romar will be master of ceremonies.

Sports highlights of the program, arranged by Dr. Plummer, will be a golf tournament, 8 a.m., at the Galloping Hill golf course August 11, Dr. P. L. Kincaid, chairman, and a tennis meet, Newark Public Park tennis courts at 1 p.m., August 12. Nine dentists, Dr. Leon W. Scott, chairman, periodontia section, will conduct a symposium on "Periodontia for the General Practitioner," at 10 a.m., Aug. 19. Following the discussion will be four demonstrations conducted by members of the panel.

Waiter Retires At 79 After 58-Year Career

Savannah, Ga. (ANP) - Georgia's most famous waiter, James A. Walker, 79, retired last week after 58 years of service at the Hotel De Soto. Company officials and colored employees attended a retirement party in his honor. He received many gifts from friends he had made during his many years of work. Charles E. Day, vice president and general manager of the hotel and chairman of the retirement party committee, told him he would get a monthly check from the hotel for the rest of his life.

HAITIAN FISCAL AFFAIRS FACE UN INVESTIGATION

LAKE SUCCESS (ANP) - Investigation of Haiti's economic affairs is promised by United Nations, and a group of experts is being sent to the Caribbean republic to help solve some of its more pressing problems.

Several Negroes have visited Haiti and are fully aware of what is happening there to throttle the nation. Dr. Rayford Logan of Howard University visited the island at the request of the United States government eight years ago and submitted a report on his return which never was released to the public.

Dr. Logan at that time was critical of the operations of the famed organization SHADA, the society for the development of the island's agricultural products. This and other octopus-like units strangled the native initiative and sapped the revenues which the island should have enjoyed.

REPORT SUPPRESSED Why Dr. Logan's report was suppressed by government officials has never been revealed, but the fact remains that Dr. Logan did visit Haiti and made an intensive and extensive survey which he included in his report. He has never revealed its contents since it was government property.

Dr. Logan was wine and dined by Haiti's then top folk, but this did not prevent him from relating

Dr. Mercey Cook has also told some interesting stories of the Haitian republic, showing where outside interests siphoned off the cream of the revenue, leaving the island's affairs and income in a highly muddled state.

What the United Nations committee proposes to do is to adjust and in the island and offer suggestions for improving the general economic status.

Newsmen Criticize Daily News Stories On Minority Groups

CHICAGO (ANP) - Nothing was held back as nine journalists seven men and two women, winners of Nieman fellowships, lashed at the treatment in news stories of minorities by the nation's white press, in an article appearing in the September issue of the Negro Digest.

The views of these journalism winners, now entitled to a year of

study at Harvard University, were reported by Mark Harris. Their biggest criticisms came against the subject of rape, the use of ape with Negro jokes in various papers.

"Rape," the article says, "has been so distorted in white press as to be synonymous with the word 'rape'." One paper even inserted the picture of a Negro in the first paragraph of a rape story to mislead readers.
