# SCHOLARSHIPS GO BEGGING IN

- Four-year scholarships are available for 15 Negro college students, but no one seems to want them.

The Lewis, Senatorial and House scholarships are awarded annually to students in each of 67 counties to those who successfully pass a standardized examination in English, social studies, science and mathematics.

An analysis of the scholarships awarded during 1947 and 1948 shows that of the 605 Negroes who took examinations 226 or 37 per cent passed as compared with 1,251 whites who passed out of a total of 1,317 taking examinations,

There are, however, 134 scholarship holders at Florida A. and M. College, of these, 115 are Lewis scholarships which pay \$400 per year to the student, the other 19 are distributed be ween Senatorial and House scholarships.

### · Soil Conservation Competition Is Won By Georgia Farmer

A cash award of \$100 and a chance to compete for further honors are the prizes which have been won by an Anso County farmer, John P. Harris of Route 2, Polkton. winner in the North Carolina Negro soil conservation contest for 1948, according to J. Frank Doggett, Extension soil conservationist at State College.

Harris will be given a free trip to the soil conservation jamboree to be held at the Georgia Industrial College for Negroes, Savannah, later this summer. At that time the 12 State winners will compete for first place in the South, and the champion will receive an addition-

Harris' farm is located in the Brown Creek soil consevation district, which was the first district organized in the nation.

23 ENTERED A total of 23 farmers etnered the North Carolina contest, and 10 of

them scored above 90 per cent. Harris owns a 55-acre farm which he bought in 1936. At that time, he says, every acre was badly eroded. and "I could have buried all the livestock I had in just one of the outs, five bushels: wheat two codes oats, five bushels; wheat, two and yields were very low: Corn and a half bushels; cototn 125 pounds.

Assisted by Soil Conservation and Extension personnel. Harris began to make plans for improving the farm. Terraces were laid off, and most of the steep land was put in pasture. Alfalfa and lespedeza BLADDE were seeded, and strip cropping LIVER L was practiced.


