1,000 Attend 4-H Family Rally Day Program

More than 1,000 Negro 4-H Club members, their parents and friends attended the joint 4-H Family Rally Day program for Halifax and Warren Counties at Littleton recently.

Group singing family progress reports, adult and 4-H quiz contests, and recreational activities were features of the program.

A report on the three-year progress of the Scotland Neck Curb Market showed that farm commodities brought the sellers a supplementary income of \$12,197.56 during the two-hour weekly selling time.

A Warren County home demonstration leader told how club women had purchased home conveniences with side crops.

The family quiz contest created much interest as the participants tried to answer 40 farm and home questions asked by the quizmaster.

Former St. Aug. Dean Gets Post At Hampton

HAMPTON, Va. — Appointment of Miss E. Estelle Thomas as Hampton Institute's new Dean of Women has been announced by Collis H. Davis, Dean of Students and member of the Interim Administrative Committee of the college.

Miss Thomas, who will assume her new position on about September 1, replaces Mrs. Faith Jefferson Jones, whose resignation becomes effective August 31st.

The new dean of women has held a variety of educational and social-religious positions throughout the years, in a steadily ascending scale of importance.

Before coming to Hampton, she had been YWCA Secretary at Montclair, N. J. for two years and teacher and Dean of Women at Bishop Tuttle School of Social Work, St. Augustine's College, in Raleigh.

Since leaving Hampton, she has spent four years with the National USO Division of the YWCA, three years as Dean of Women at Southern University and the past two years as the head of the Newark YWCA.

Bishops Meet to Draft Plans To Rais Funds For Wilberforce University

WILBERFORCE, Ohio (ANP) — A debt of \$120,000 for Wilberforce University was announced last week as the schools executive board of five AME bishops met and mapped out plans to make the school an accredited institution once more.

Attending the board meeting were Bishops A. J. Allen, D. Ward Nichols, George Bayer, D. O. Walker and J. H. Clynburn of the First, Fourth, Fifth and 13th districts.

Despite the large debt of the school, the bishops confidently stated that they expected to pull the school out of its present rut and raise it once more to the top.

Of the total debt, \$30,000 is owed to the Citizens National Bank in Xenia. It is to be paid in September. Teachers are owed \$10,000 in back salary, and summer school teachers are owed about \$3,000.

The five bishops, who make up the first AME educational area, have under-written the \$30,000 to be paid to the Citizens bank.

In the reorganization scheme, the executive board announced that the Wilberforce high school unit will be closed. It also voted \$300,000 for operation and maintenance during 1948-49 school year. The bishops expect to pay the bank and the teachers by October.

A new three story building which will house 100 students and serve as an administration and chapel is being erected for Payne Theological seminary which was recently moved to Wilberforce, Dr. John H. Lewis revealed.

In order to assure return of Wilberforce to an accredited status under the North Central association, the board of trustees, the president, the faculty and officers of the school are working together harmoniously.

- Soon after Mr. Truman became President of the United States he began his crusade for equal opportunity by openly requesting that the Rules Committee report out the FEPC bill.
• His January 3rd, 1946 message to Congress contained a request for the enactment of FEPC legislation. He thereby became the first President to make such a request officially of the Congress of the United States.
• Mr. Truman made history when he made the precedent breaking appointments of William H. Hastie as Governor of the Virgin Islands and Irving C. Mollison as Judge of the United States Customs Court.
• He appointed a special committee of distinguished Americans and charged them with the responsibility of reviewing the entire status of minority groups in this country.
• This committee known as the President's Committee on Civil Rights, presented its report to the President. He did not file it away. He ordered it released officially and it has become our charter of freedom.
• February 1948, in a special message, President Truman called upon Congress to enact Civil Rights legislation.
• On July 26, 1948, President Truman issued two executive orders which initiated a program for the end of segregation and discrimination in the armed forces and Federal government.
• President Truman has refused to back down in the face of great pressure by those who would sabotage his Civil Rights program.
