Less quietly filed in with the hope of presenting their case on the Rosedale situation. Being denied this privilege, they quickly walked out of the meeting and began to picket it.

#### QUESTIONS EFFECT OF NEW POLICIES ON ARMY SERVICE CLUBS

BOSTON (ANP) -- Will the proposed "New Look" regarding integration in the U. S. Armed forces mean the mixing of white and colored troops including draftees in all camp service clubs and USO units at home and abroad? And will that mean white and colored hostesses working together?

At Ft. Devens here in New England, the director of civil personnel is quoted as stating flatly that there will not be any segregation at Devens regarding service clubs. The implication is that there will not be any separate clubs operated by all white and all colored since they existed during the last war, although Devens did have mixed USO units and generally was one of the most democratic training camps in the United States and has been for years.

Nevertheless, the question of creating entirely integrated service club staffs is not yet answered. Even at Devens at this writing, former colored service club workers, including a former director, have made inquiries toward serving on a mixed staff but without any noticeable satisfaction.

Since Devens is one of the foremost training cities in the north the "policy" here will be keenly studied by leaders all over the nation. It is generally expected that

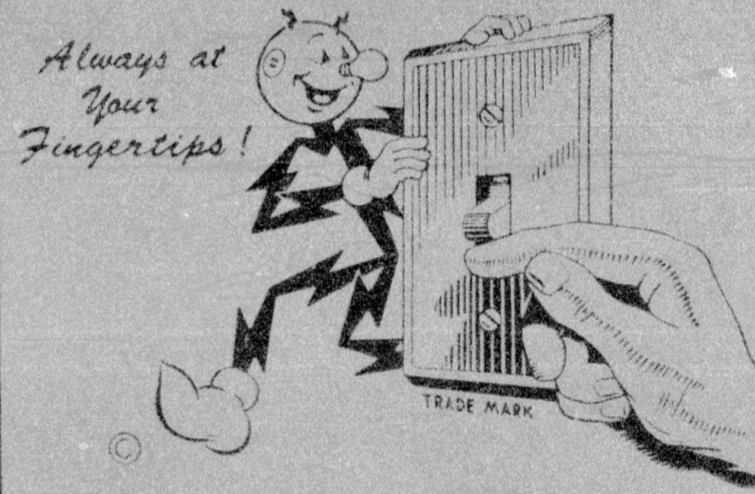
