NEW YORK (AP)—Reorganization of Exclusive Records company offices in New York to include handling of Leon Rene's music publishing firms was announced this week by J. Parker Prescott, general manager of Exclusive's eastern division offices.

Prescott will direct publishing, exploitation and promotion for Rene's Records Music publishers, Broadcast Music Inc. (BMI) affiliate, and Leon Rene publications, American Society of Composers Authors and Publishers (ASCAP) firm "Gloria." Rene's current ASCAP hit has been selected the first tune to receive special promotion under the new set-up.

Prescott also announced establishment of a store at 606 Tenth Avenue which will primarily serve as a record pick-up station for coin machine operators.
