Tobias Lists Ten Reasons Why We Should Support President Harry Truman

SYRACUSE, N.Y.—Dr. Charles Tobias, director of the National Committee for Civil Rights, is solidly behind the President's Committee on Civil Rights. He pointed out that when Mr. Truman was a senator he "distinguished himself for his unflinching forces and civilian government service of progressive legislation."

The Count has just concluded a lengthy stay in the east, when kept him on Broadway for nine consecutive weeks by way of a record-breaking six-week run at the Strand Theater and a sensational three-week stand at the popular Royal Roost night.

On his coming jaunt through the midlands, the Jump King will play theater and dance dates in a total of 17 states en route to California where he'll tee off his annual invasion of the west coast early in December.

The Count's one-night tour will be broken on October 22 when he takes to the stage of the Paradise Theater in Detroit for a week's engagement in his annual appearance at that Motor City house.
