DR. ELDER SPEAKS AS CHURCH MARKS ITS 32ND YEAR

Durham, N. C. — Last Sunday the White Rock Baptist Church continued its series of special services in observance of the 32nd anniversary of its founding with an address at the 11 a. m. worship hour by Dr. Alfonso Elder, president of North Carolina College here.

President Elder expressed pleasure at being able to speak at White Rock Baptist Church, "because of what this institution has always meant to North Carolina College. Without the support and prayers of this church and community," he said "the walls of our institution would crumble and there would be no college here".

He pointed out the common interest and the common responsibility which the college and the church have in improving the quality of understanding among young people, and he outlined three ways in which the two institutions can share in giving aid to youth.

It was his opinion that youth needs help first in "knowing what is". Youth must also be helped, he said, "to understand what may be but what is not now, and to be guided by what ought to be but which has never been and perhaps never will be."

Dr. Elder stated that it is easy to point out to students the things that now exist such as the languages, customs, and beliefs which we approve, but this should not be the final objective of education. He expressed the belief that "it is our job to assist a person in what he may be and in what he may become."

The search for that which ought to be but which has never been is illustrated in the scientist's search for truth, the speaker states, as well as the search for justice through political life; the struggle for complete equality thru democracy, and a striving for holiness through religion.

KING COLE'S 1ST WIFE WINS \$200 WEEKLY ALIMONY

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Nat "King" Cole was ordered by the Los Angeles Superior Court last week to pay his first wife \$200 a week alimony until she remarries plus further financial and property judgments.

The ruling was made against the noted leader of the King Cole Trio after Mrs. Bell Nadine Cole had accused him of being \$800 behind in his payments.

Cole was also ordered to divide \$15,000 in bank with her and to pay her half of money from the sale of a new automobile.

His alimony payments originally began in January when he also agreed to pay the balance of \$8,357 on a new home for her and \$1,100 repairs on the house. He will pay her alimony through the county board of trustees in the future.
