

important Fair Employment Practice Commission by the sound steps taken in Mrs. Terrell's case alone.

Therefore, we the women of the National Council of Negro Women, representing more than 300,000 members, thinking with and for the six and one half million women in our minority group of this country, realize very well how important to the appointment of Judge Amabel Matthews to the recently created Fair Employment Practice Commission.

Judge Matthews has borne the stamp of discrimination against minority groups and has very definitely demonstrated this in her fight against the reappointment of Mrs. Mary Church Terrell in the Washington Branch of the American Association of University Women.

Returning to the need for improved Negro housing in the city and the League's views on the situation, he said:

"The following is what we have found to be true: (1) All of the money necessary to build homes and apartments is available if the cost can be kept to a reasonable amount. (2) Those willing to finance the building of homes and apartments for colored people want to know that the colored people are really interested in better homes. Since the city officials will have something to say about this building program, they will also want to know how the colored people feel about it."

Plans for the project call for a minimum of fifty units with recreation and other community rooms provided for the use of the tenants.

The League has established an information bureau which is prepared to furnish information on the current labor picture and recent developments in the field of veterans' housing.

Touching upon the current employment situation, it was pointed out that increasing mechanization of farms in the South has resulted in a considerable displacement of farm laborers for whom the best chances for employment will result from a program of home construction throughout the area.

PLEA FOR RACIAL

he had often warned that the governors of southern states might conduct a joint survey to determine how far off all what aspirations of the Negro would endanger racial peace and what aspirations could threaten to bring about so-called ousting of intercession.

"Then," he added, "let bars be put up against those dangers. But then remove the bars against legitimate aspirations of the colored race."

The speaker also appealed to his audience to permit the colored man "to realize his just ambitions as a matter of right and not of concession."

Declaring that he was "disturbed" by the declaration of Federal District Judge J. Walter Waring of South Carolina that the colored man would never be voting in that state if it were not for the compulsion exercised by the law, he said that such an attitude and expression provided ammunition for the radicals among Negroes who would seek their gains by force.


