ASK VETERANS TO CHANGE GI BILL CERTIFICATION

World War II veterans holding unused certificates of eligibility for G. I. Bill education or training listed before September 1 should exchange them immediately for a new type certificate if they plan to enter training for the first time after January 1, the Veterans Administration said.

The certificates may be exchanged in person or by mail at any Veterans Administration office, VA pointed out.

The exchange is being urged VA said because of new registration techniques that will be used after January 1, to safeguard the interests of veterans and the government. One advantage of the new certificates is that they will be accepted by schools and the VA without question. Old certificates are not acceptable until verified, if printed out.
