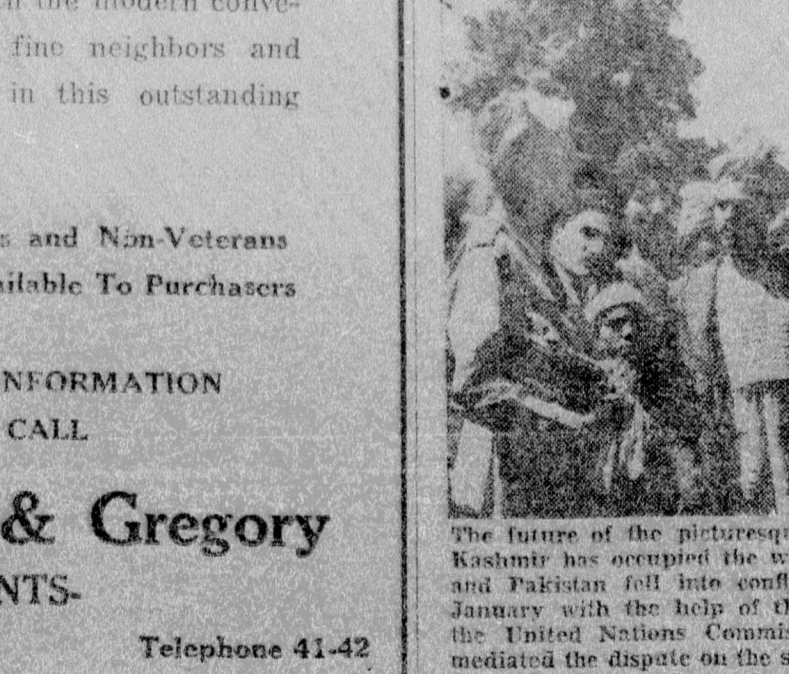
J. Willie Kenney of Rocky Mount died in New York City last week. Funeral services were held at Leggettts Chapel, Leggettts, N. C.

Whether you iron by hand or have a modern ironer, these are hints to keep your sheets and linen towels well-groomed.

First, sprinkle with clear warm water — it penetrates the fibres more evenly. Fold each piece separately until you iron. Dampened clothes should stand several hours before ironing...

Light cotton needs hot temperature; heavy cottons need a very hot temperature iron your cotton while damp; keep hems straight and even and iron till dry. Be sure wrinkles are not ironed in selvages.

For pure linen use a very hot iron and iron while linen is damp. For embroidery or monograms, iron on the wrong side.

Never iron heavy towels or wash cloths as it flattens the loops making them less absorbent, and they feel stiff and harsh.

To avoid linen closet woes, put your household linen away properly. First of all, be sure it is completely dry thereby avoiding mildew which is caused by wet things remaining in a bag or a poorly ventilated room before drying.

Cover your white linen with blue paper if it will be unused for some time. Storing linen in cedar chests or drawers yellows it. Don't store linen with disinfectants, medicines, cleaning fluids or polishes as they may contain chemicals that are injurious to your linen.

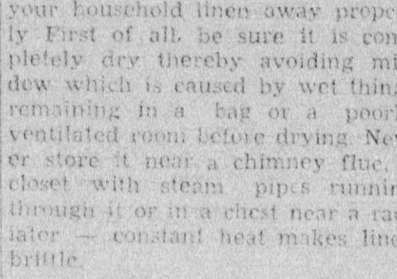
