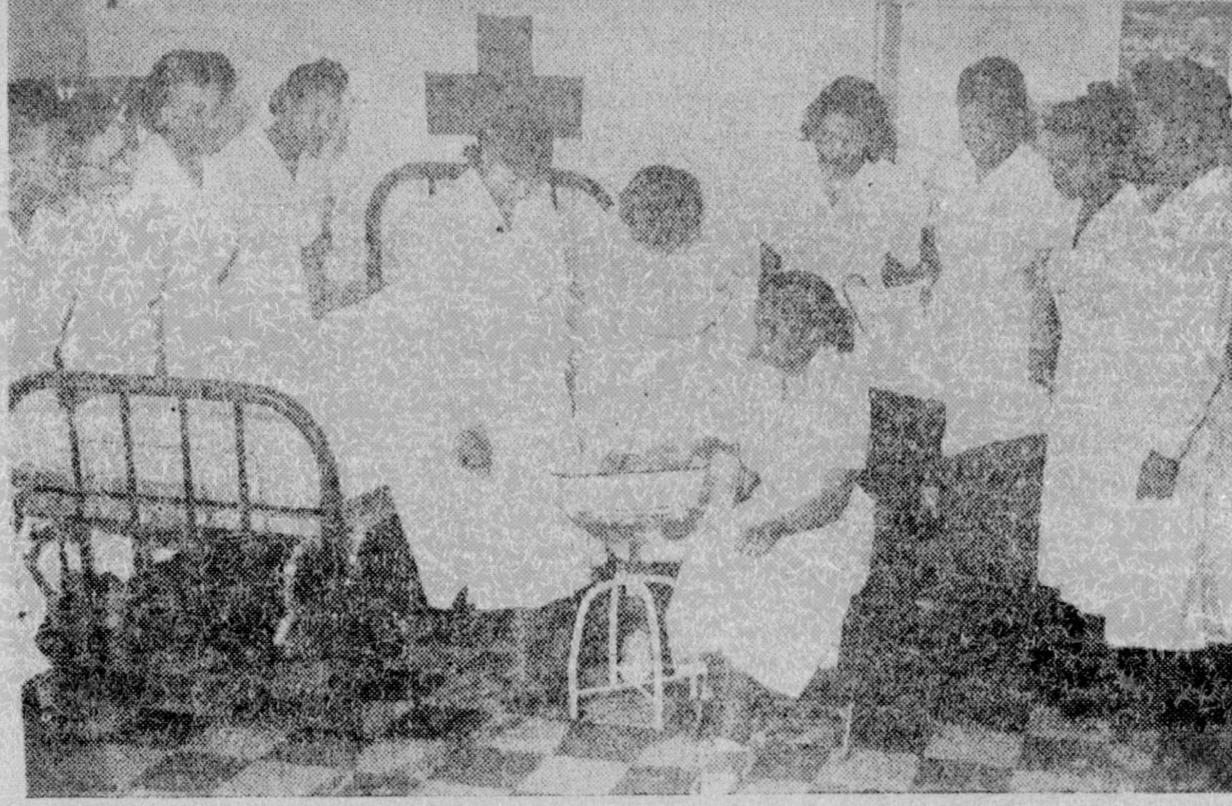


SOME PROGRESS SEEN IN BANNING BIAS IN U. S. ARMED SERVICES

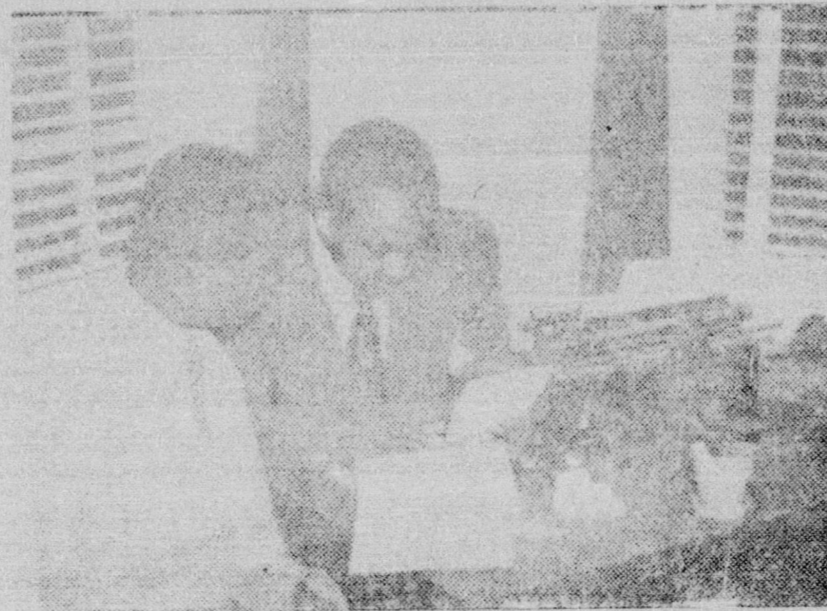
