FINED \$124 IN HIT-RUN DEATH

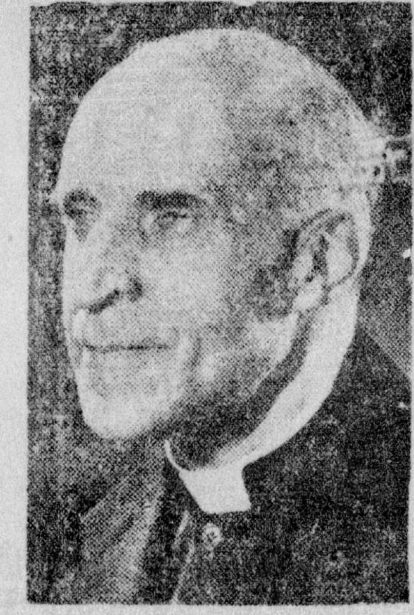
