Robert Hinton, 721 East Davis Street, received a sentence of 20 months in the county for three counts.

Hinton got 12 months for assault with a deadly weapon on an officer, 12 months for injury, and 6 months for assault on a female.

Hinton is charged with leaping over the shoulder of a girl seated at the lunch counter in Woolworth's and striking her with a knife. Officer F. J. Denton was notified of the theft and pursued Hinton to the Yellow Cab Stand at McDowell and Davis Streets, where he attempted to arrest him. Hinton threatened Denton with a knife, the officer claimed, whereupon he drew his gun and removed the knife from Hinton's hand.

Davis had pleaded guilty to charges of assault with a deadly weapon. He had shot Dorothy Bryant following an argument over her conduct. Suddenly he asked her if she would marry him. Judge R. Hunt Parker had to quiet courtroom laughter before Davis could hear his acceptance.

The couple has to prove to the court in a few days that they have been married. Meanwhile, Davis paid court costs and hospital bills incurred as a result of the shooting.

Freddie Pitts, 17, is on a three-year probationary period. He was originally charged with the murder of Woodard Wain.

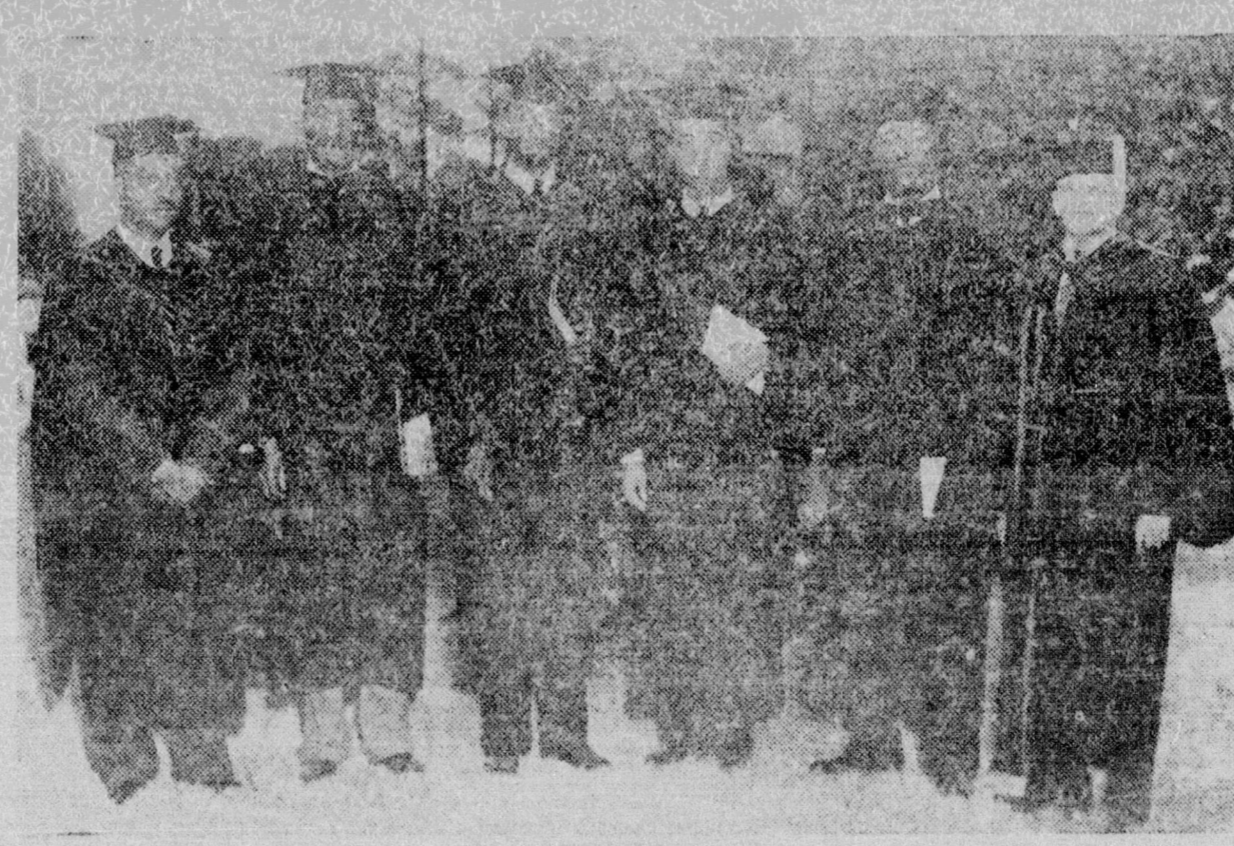

FORBES DELIVERS WH BACCALAUREATE

The baccalaureate sermon for the 47th annual graduating class of the Washington High School was delivered by the Rev. J. H. Forbes of the Providence Episcopal Church on Sunday at the First Baptist Church.

Hunt For Triple Killer Spreads Into Three States

The manhunt for outlawed James Diggs continues throughout three states.

Diggs is charged with the murder of his wife and two children in Norfolk, Va. He became outlawed in magistrate proceedings after he had shot Patrolman Rex R. Howell of Hamlet in the morning.

Since Diggs has been declared a "false alarm" about his appearances, a man identified by fingerprints as Henry Afford was picked up near Smithfield Sunday night.

Walter Anderson, SBI agent, said that Afford escaped from a South Carolina work gang on Sunday, May 29, while serving a term for burglary. South Carolina officers are being notified to pick him up.

The search for Diggs began in Norfolk about 3:20 p. m. last Friday, when Alfonso, four, James, six, sons of the outlaw, and Ruth Diggs, his wife, were found shot to death in a bedroom of her home, 2224 Courtney Street, Norfolk.

Their bodies were discovered when policemen acting on a tip, broke into the house about 3:20 p. m.

The bodies of the children, clad in sleeping clothes, lay together on a sleeping bed. The mother, fully dressed, lay on another bed. Signs of a struggle were all about

the room—broken glass and photographs records and disarranged furniture. All doors were barred.

Policemen detected difficulties between the couple given by person who knew them. Mrs. Diggs has sworn out a warrant for her husband's arrest the night before the tragedy.

The family on the second floor of the residence was not at home when the killings took place.

 4. Pour batter into hot greased corn stick pans and bake in a hot oven (450° F.) 15 to 20 minutes.
