WHITE CLEARED FOR SHOOTING NEGRO IN BACK

IRWINGTON, Ga. (AP) — Coroner's jury returned a verdict last week of justifiable homicide in the case of a white who fatally shot a Negro in back on the night of July 9. The shooting was Thomas Porter, 28-year-old student at a Negro Vocational School. The shooting took place out a roadhouse in Gordon, Ga., miles northwest of here. The suspect was fired by C. R. Miller, white resident of Gordon.

According to the testimony given by Miller and five Negroes the night before an all-white jury Miller sought to intervene a quarrel between the victim as a 14-year-old boy Porter was to have had trouble with the boy and was roughing him up when Miller sought to intervene. PORTER RAN Porter fussed with Miller but the elderly man broke away and went to his car for a gun. Porter turned and ran but was dropped by a bullet fired by Miller. The shot went through the victim's back, piercing his heart. "I shot him because I was afraid to fight him," Miller told the jury. The verdict means the case is closed as far as Wilkinson County authorities are concerned. The county is also the scene of a so far unpunished lynching which took place last May 30 after a Negro had been jailed for disorderly conduct. The sheriff left the jail unguarded with keys on the dining room table of his unlocked home. The victim, Caleb (Pickie Pie) Hill, 28-year-old chalk miner, was found shot to death on a rural highway after being kidnapped from the jail. Two men were arrested but a grand jury voted no-bills on evidence gathered by the Georgia bureau of investigation.

BEAUTICIAN INVENTS COMB

Mrs. Fannie Price, an inventive-minded New York beautician, has invented a hair straightening comb with detachable teeth and a replaceable handle. For years beauticians have been discontent with a comb that would be rendered useless by warped or bent teeth. Seeing clearly what was wrong as far back as 1937, the inventor beautician went to work and made just two simple changes in the ordinary straightening comb. The news of her accomplishment spread throughout the country among her fellow craftsmen.

After getting her invention patented she sought a company to start work on her project, but the war interrupted her prospects of production. Last year the Patented Products Company of Hartford, Conn. agreed to manufacture the combs. The second week in June of this year her invention began to roll off the assembly lines. OTHER INVENTIONS Mrs. Price has two other patented inventions; a combination comb and brush, and a curling iron, not yet on the market. She is working on another invention which she refuses to discuss.

In addition to her invention, Mrs. Price has compounded certain oils from several natural products in a secret process to produce an oil scalp treatment that is the envy of her competitor. She is also the discoverer of a cream for the care of the scalp. Born in Petersburg, Va., Mrs. Price attended the public schools in her hometown and Newport News, coming to New York from Poughkeepsie, she studied beauty culture at the Madam C. J. Walker School. She also received private lessons from a prominent scalp specialist at Newport News. Her beauty salon, the Princess, is located on Eighth Avenue at 126th Street in New York City.
