She was mised at breakfast by Sister Meekness, who went b room in search of her only to find her body hauging from rope tied to the top of her doorway. Efforts by police officials to locate relatives or friends who

would see to her burial proved futile and on Monday the city provided for the burial of a lonely "angel" whose death was listed as suicide.


