NAME CLUBWOMEN IN SLANDER SUIT

ST. LOUIS (AP) — A \$15,000 law suit charging libel and slander was filed in circuit court here last week against Atty. John Pope II and Mrs. Margaret Gomme, former president of the International Toastmaster's Club, both white, by Mrs. (Queen) Lacy Carter and Ossie Singer of this city.

The suit, filed through Atty. J. E. Clarke, White, Hutchinson, John W. Hasty and Richard E. Burns, centers around an incident which occurred at the last annual convention of the international group in St. Paul, Minn., last July 24-27. Mrs. Carter and Mrs. Miller attended the convention as accredited delegates from the Young Women and Las Omega clubs of St. Louis and Alton, Ill. Their mission was to protect the reputation of Mrs. of the chapters of the two clubs.

According to the suit, Pope suggested at a pre-convention caucus that the Negro delegates be elected to change their minds with the result being that Negro clubs should not be permitted to have further affiliation with the international organization. This was rejected by the northern and western state representatives.

Pope is also said to have demanded a feature of a police raid on the three delegates which styled the women as "prostitutes," "drunkards," "scoundrels," a non-union police character.

The charges of libel, Yates, Gomez and Alton clubs were revised several weeks before the convention by action of the international board of directors because of a concentrated attack by these clubs in preventing the south central regional council from holding its spring meet at Hotel Coronado, St. Louis, last April 30-May 1. The clubs opposed the St. Louis meeting because Negro clubs were tried to send their votes in by proxy.
