



HOUSING OF NEGRO STUDENT CREATES PROBLEM AT OKLA. U

NORMAN, Okla. (ANP) The refusal of Julius C. Hill. to, of Tul a to accept cancellation of his reservation for a from on the University of Okfahoma campus, made rocky the position of two unwritten but effective Jim crow laws at the school.

Hill, a graduate student in English, protested to University Provident George L. Cross that its reservation for a room had been cancelled although his deposit of \$10 had been accepted. He explained that he had mailed in his application with the word "American" written in the blank for race.

Cross summoned the board of regents into an extra sessien to discuss the matter. The board ruled that Hill was entitled to housing accommodatoins on the campus and also that he might remain in the university city of Norman after dark. They ordered Cross to enfonce segregation "to the greatest extent," but gave him power to "set up temporary housing for Negroes." Urosa said it would take two or three days to get temporary housing


